This is part of the club's winter fitness program and they would


like to open it up to the community.



**QATHET REGIONAL DISTRICT SECURES 30 YEAR LEASE FOR EMILY LAKE LANDS** The qathet Regional District (qRD) is pleased to announce the approval of a 30 year lease renewal for the Emily Lake trail and recreation area on Texada Island.



For 19 years, the qRD has maintained the Emily Lake recreation area and the surrounding 12.7 kilometer trail system. Emily Lake is famous for its historic and culturally significant camp, western painted turtles and warm lake waters.

"The Emily Lake lease renewal is welcome news for residents of Texada Island who are enjoying Emily Lake in record numbers," said Electoral Area D Director, Sandy McCormick. "The 30 year lease will ensure this culturally and historically significant area of natural beauty will continue to be preserved and maintained for the recreational pleasure of residents and visitors alike."

The Emily Lake trail system and recreation area are managed by volunteers serving on the Texada Island Recreation Commission (TIRC). TIRC requested the qRD renew the lease for this area. 

## TIRC

Happy New Year Texada! At its December 2020 meeting, the Texada Island Recreation Commission (TIRC) recommended to qRD that the bleachers at the Gillies Bay and Van Anda ball fields be removed before they become hazardous. This recommendation was adopted by qRD and reaffirmed at TIRC's March 2021 meeting. It is expected that the Gillies Bay bleachers may last another year whereas the Van Anda bleachers may last another two years. After the bleachers are removed, other structures could be built or installed to increase the functionality of the ball field recreational sites. TIRC welcomes the community's suggestions in this regard and will be putting a survey out in January to get community input. Surveys will be located at the Van Anda Store, Gillies Bay Store and Recycling Depot. Keep your eye out, fill out a survey, and let us know what you would like to see at these locations.



## MUSEUM MUSINGS Charlie Klein (1892 - 1960)

One colourful character in Texada's history was logger Charlie Klein. Margaret Woodhead saw him as a "Bull of the Woods" man. At 6 feet tall and powerfully-built, Charlie was renowned for being able to lift a full drum of gasoline onto a truck.

Noted as one of the "finest axemen around these parts", Charlie would test the sharpness of his axe on his arm hairs before making his undercuts, which turned out as smooth as if planed.

The Klein family (children of German immigrants) purchased an 80-acre property in Pender Harbour, allowing their 9 children to farm and later subdivide. In 1913, their sons (Klein Brothers Logging Company) started logging on the coast with teams of powerful Clydesdale horses (one weighing over a ton), dragging the logs to the beach on greased skids.

Kleins' horse logging came to Texada in the 1930's when they moved operations to Mouat Bay. Charlie built bunkhouses and sank the CP steamship *Princess Beatrice* to use as a breakwater.

In winter, Charlie would tend traplines, camping on beaches along Sabine Channel. He thought nothing of rowing to "Kleindale" (Pender Harbour) to cut firewood for his mom. Once he rowed to the hospital at Garden Bay to get treatment for a nasty thumb wound delivered by a dying raccoon.

"Charlie loved his horses," remarked Texada pioneer Joe Pillat. In fact, he had no appreciation for anything "mechanical".

Once at the Mouat Bay site, brother Pete attempted to show Charlie how to operate a cat. When it was time to stop, Charlie panicked and started pulling all the levers, shouting "Whoa!" The cat crashed through the walls of two bunkhouses, finally stopping just short of the water!

Despite appearances, Charlie had another side. He planted pansies. He wrote hu-

morous songs and poems and was a great storyteller. In retirement, he enjoyed pub nights and was a hit with the ladies.

Charlie transferred his Texada properties to his son, Victor, who continued to live on the island. The logging operations were sold to Oke Nyvall and partners.

It is fitting that Charlie's gravesite at the Kleindale cemetery had to be expanded by dynamite to accommodate this "larger than life" character.



## **Garden Club Notes**

"Eat your greens." We certainly heard that one growing up and maybe you even said it to your own kids. Well, it really is sage advice. Jocelyn Fournier's article is all about green goodness.

Dark green vegetables are a great heart health food and a must in the winter months. Spinach, kale, romaine lettuce, collard greens, Swiss chard, broccoli, and Brussels sprouts are high in fiber, iron, magnesium, calcium, potassium, folate, and Vitamin C which will also help our immune system keep those winter ailments down. They are also low in carbohydrates and calories, so don't be afraid to eat a healthy portion; at least half of your plate should consist of dark green steamed vegetables or a kale or spinach salad.

The best part is you don't have to necessarily shop for them as they are easy to grow and a lot of us have them in our gardens right now. If you don't, I'll bet a neighbour or friend has enough and will gladly share.

If you have never created a winter garden, perhaps it is something to consider late next summer when it is time to think of what you would like to see grow for your winter eating pleasure. Some of these dark green vegetables need to be started in the summer to get your winter and spring crop, albeit it's hard to think of a winter garden when we are in the midst of a heat wave! But trust me, it is so worth planning for winter food and you do need to plan. Brussels sprouts in January taste sweet and delicious!

Sprouting broccoli may appear to freeze over the winter. Be patient, they will spring back as soon as the weather changes and you'll have abundant broccoli to eat in early spring while you wait for your late spring and early summer crops.

#### Warm Caesar Salad

1-2 Romaine hearts High heat cooking oil Olive oil Balsamic vinegar S&P Parmesan cheese (optional)

Slice lettuce hearts in half lengthwise. Brush cut side with high heat oil and grill in pan on medium heat until it softens and browns slightly. Turn open-faced on a plate and sprinkle with olive oil, balsamic vinegar, salt and pepper and cheese if desired. Experiment with other seasonings or herbs and enjoy!

## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Happy New Year!

Every year there is \$8,000 in the area D grant-in-aid budget for Texada community groups and organizations who need a financial boost during the year. Typically, grantsin-aid cover 25 per cent of the cost of an event or project. The first intake for applications for grants-in-aid is March 31 and the second is August 31.

Everyone who plans to apply for this grant money is encouraged to do so early as funds are allocated on a first-come-firstserved basis.

In 2021, the following received area D grant-in-aid funding: TIC (\$3,000), TAG (\$237.25), TACT Ceramic Studio (\$1130.64), VAID (\$500), K-Lumet (\$1170), and our share of ORCA Bus costs (\$1,654.11). There was \$308 left over, which will be rolled into the 2022 grant-in-aid budget.

Additionally, TACT received \$12,000 in economic development funding, and \$100,000 of Community Works money is earmarked for deer fencing at our airport, a requirement of Transport Canada.

Development of the 2022 Financial Plan (budget) is now underway and we will likely face a property tax increase this year. The main driver of the increase is in waste management with \$10.40 being added to every property tax bill in the region includ-

Call Frazer at 604-414-8269 ing the City, to pay for debt financing for the new Resource Recovery Centre. Insurance rates are also up by 10 per cent. I've argued that with COVID curtailment of activities many people can't afford to pay more taxes and that a property tax increase creates hardship for many residents. I've asked the RD finance team to sharpen their pencils to try to reduce proposed taxes. Stay tuned.

Prior to the latest Covid restrictions, I invited our local highways manager, Rino Parise, to Texada to meet with residents regarding road maintenance issues. A meeting had been planned for Jan. 17 but this is now postponed until the current restrictions are lifted.

Finally, although local government elections are 10 months away, I'm already being asked if I will seek another term as Texada's regional director. The answer is yes, I will.
