







IN LOVING MEMORY



Rudolph Charles Lipus July 1935 – March 2020

The connection with family and friends and the community togetherness spirit is what makes Texada special. It had been Rudy's home for over 60 years. Though he is now gone and his place on Oak Street sold, Texada will always hold a special place for the Lipus family.

Rudolph (Rudy) was born to Anne and Karol (Charles) Lipus in Waldron Saskatchewan in July 1935.

As the eldest of 14 children and living on a farm, Rudy had many responsibilities. From looking after the animals to helping with his siblings, there was much to do. Between his responsibilities around the home, Rudy managed to carve out some time for fun. With a large family, playing baseball with his siblings was one obvious pastime.

Rudy lived in Melville until his 20s when he moved to his Aunt Mary's on Texada Island in the late 1950s. He was looking for employment in the booming mining industry and was soon employed with the Texada Island Mine. When the mine closed in 1977, he was hired at Blubber Bay Quarry and worked as a heavy duty mechanic. In his final working years, he moved to a position less physically demanding.

In the early 1960s, Rudy caught the eye of a young lady, Janet, and on May 2, 1964 Rudolph Charles married Janette Maxine Copp.

For the first year of their marriage Rudy and Janet lived in Janet's parents' cabin at the "Oasis" located between Gillies Bay and Van Anda. Just after their first son, Charles, was born in 1965, they purchased property on Oak Street and built the house that he would live in for the rest of his life. After Charles was born, Rudy and Janet had another son, Rick, in 1967, and a daughter, Christine, in 1971.

Rudy's young family loved riding horses. During the summer months, people gathered at the Gravel Pit and, either as a spectator or as a horse-riding participant, enjoyed the activities of the Saddle Tramps. His was just one of the many families who looked forward to these events. Rudy continued to be an active member in the sporting community. He played baseball in the spring and summer months, toting his family to various tournaments locally and on Vancouver Island. In the fall and winter, he bowled as a member of the Texada Island Bowling League and in later years Texada Legion Darts replaced bowling and he took up golfing. It appeared that no matter what sport in which he partook, a trophy or ribbon adorned the shelf.

Rudy was also an avid card player. Whether it was teaching his kids cribbage or a family night of Russian Rummy, playing cards was prominent in his social circle. However, with the passing of Janet, his wife of 50 years, playing cards just wasn't the same but Rudy was still part of the gaming scene. He would often call the monthly Bingo game at the Gillies Bay Community Hall. He was also known to make an occasional appearance playing his accordion at the local talent shows.

Even when his trips to the golf course with family and friends became less frequent, Dad liked to keep busy outside, cutting the grass, puttering in his workshop or tending to his fruit trees and garden. It was a lot of work for just one person and fortunately his gardening was a collaboration with his good friends and neighbours Ray and Marion. If you didn't see him outside you'd be sure to find him having a game of crib with Ray.

Rudy loved to be social and seemed to find a familiar face to talk to no matter where he was. He was caring and generous and, like many Texadans, would help out his fellow community members when they were in need. Rudy helped out at Better at Home for a brief period, driving clients to their appointments on the island or in Powell River.

At 84 years young, he led a full life. Either as a volunteer with the Gillies Bay Fire Department, a furnace repair man, a heavy duty mechanic or the "Go-to Guy" who taxied people around from the Texada Airport, he wore many hats. He was a valued member of the community and he kept giving, even days before he fell ill. He touched the lives of many and will remain forever in our hearts. In March

2020, Rudy died peacefully on the palliative unit at St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver while listening to his beloved accordion music.

He is survived by his sons Charles (Raquel) and Rick, his daughter Christine (Aaron), his grandchildren: Crystal, Janine, Ariel, Kaylee, Aurora, Darwin and Parker; his great grandchildren Kayla, Cameron and Cassandra. Rudy was the oldest child of 14 and is survived by his siblings Elsie, Jane, Jack, Shirley, Evelyn, Joyce, Wayne, Darlene (Ed) and many nieces and nephews.

The family would like to extend their gratitude to the staff at Powell River Hospital for the care provided while Rudy awaited transfer to Vancouver. The family also acknowledges the dedication and care provided by the staff at Mount Saint Joseph's Hospital, St. Paul's ICU, and finally St. Paul's palliative unit.

The family would also like to thank the many family and friends who provided support for Rudy during his illness and to his family throughout these challenging times. The Van Anda Improvement District wishes everyone a better New Year in 2021.

Last year VAID reaped the benefits of a UBCM grant that allowed us to replace our old leaking wood stave water tank with a new 65,000-gallon steel tank and to purchase a new state-of-the-art water treatment plant. That grant represents a saving to the ratepayers of about \$850,000. We still have a few wrinkles to solve with the operations of the treatment plant and are getting a lot of advice from the supplier of the system and engineers. We are expecting to optimize the operations of the treatment plant soon. Meanwhile, the treatment plant continues to supply us with water having much higher quality that, for the first time in Van Anda, meets or exceeds the Vancouver Coastal Health requirements for safe drinking water with two methods of disinfection.

VAID's challenge in 2021 will be finding and repairing leaks in our aging distribution system, some of which was installed over 75 years ago. We always knew there were leaky pipes, and indeed all communities have them. However, with the new tank and water treatment system we were able to determine that actually half or more of the water we process is likely lost through leaks in the distribution system. Repairing leaks, replacing old pipes, and conserving water will reduce our cost of operations, ensure that water is available for fighting fires and is ecologically sustainable. You can help us with this ongoing maintenance program - please report any possible water leaks on

public or private properties in Van Anda. We will also do what we can to assist residents to help identify any home service line leakages.

- Serve to squeals of delight! Muy rico.





We had some community initiatives that we were hoping to push forward that unfortunately had to be postponed due to COVID-19. Our hope for 2021 is that we will be able to move forward with these ideas. We were not able to hold a "cram the cruiser" event for the Texada Island Food Bank, so we partnered with FreshCo to deliver a pallet of food to the food bank instead. Next month, we will be looking for community input on policing priorities for Texada, which will allow us to focus on local issues.

Back in October our phone lines went down after a wind storm and subsequent power outage. We appreciate everyone's patience and are pleased to report that our phones line are back up and running, and a reminder that the detachment phone is not

Director's Report

Happy New Year, everyone. Let's hope it's happier than the last one.

There's a saying in local government circles that getting anything done is like kicking a beanbag chair down a soccer field. You huff and puff, push, kick and pull, and the chair turns over once. Sometimes it takes a lot of determination to get to where you want to be.

There are some unfinished Texada projects at the RD that I'll be working on this year with the goal of getting them off the "to-do" list.

Official Community Plan — Staff continue to work on resolving issues with the Sechelt Nation so that the approval process can be completed. Progress is being made and board chair Patrick Brabazon and myself have offered to meet with them.

Airport — Scheduled air service to/from YGB has not been confirmed to date and I continue to dialogue with the Airport Advisory Committee and staff. The airline industry has been severely curtailed due to the pandemic.

Northeast Bay — The RD has asked the province to expand the existing UREP to include the water portion of the bay as well as the land. No response yet, but I'm continuing to lobby Victoria to make this happen.

Mt. Davies — Lasqueti Island (area E) hasn't resolved its emergency dispatch issues. Service from North Island 911 is still possible and that corporation considers our Mt. Davies as the best site for a transmission tower. This site is designated park land under our OCP and such towers should not be allowed. I'm continuing to work with the Lasqueti director to ensure another dispatch solution is found.

As well, some new initiatives on Texada are expected this year.

Longhouse — The indigenous-style gathering structure in Shelter Point Park is scheduled for construction, funded by the PR Community Forest.

Connectivity Plan — Driftwood Communications has been contracted to develop a high-speed internet Connectivity Plan for all areas of the region. They will be communicating with Texadans via on-line and paper surveys to obtain our input in developing this plan.

Stay tuned on all of the above.

Finally, good two-way communication with the public remains a priority for the current Board. To support this goal and relieve some workload from existing staff, a communications advisor will be hired by the RD this year.

The volunteer staff of the Texada AeroSpace Hangar is wishing everyone a very Happy and safe New Year!! There is hope for this year to retrace a more positive track for everyone!!

During the summer, the airport on Texada is usually buzzing with visiting planes; people are visiting the museum and gallery, browsing through books in the aviation library, bringing in donations and generally using YGB as a meeting place for flying friends. The pandemic sadly disrupted plans and activities for this year, but the dormant period is being used to upgrade and increase the organization's capability to serve youth and the flight oriented public safely and more completely.

We're looking forward to this year's events even though we have to remain compliant with the new states of vigilance and protocol. The AeroSpace Camp Hangar crew is planning the AirBuzz Mk II simulator (based on X-Plane program) to be COVIDproofed with screens between the student and the instructor, as well as installing a very efficient air extraction system to further isolate the two flight deck positions in the cockpit, to allow us to continue to provide noncertified simulator time in a very realistic cockpit. Installing Hand sanitizer stations and an efficient isolation-aware walking route through the gallery is being devised. We are looking forward also to providing our Texada Annual Fly-in event and, if possible, at least a couple of barbeque or picnic type events for the flying public.

The AeroSpace Camp Hangar crew is recruiting more people to assist continuing in creating the exhibits, library, and museum programs at the AeroSpace Hangar. Also there is a need for instructors and admin. persons to help in student registration and helping youth with learning to rivet, use light hand tools, radios operating the wind tunnel, and for launching water rockets. There are a number of very talented people who have volunteered over the years but help is always welcome. Please call 604-223-2588 (Doby Dobrostanski) for details.

MUSEUM MUSINGS Louis B Seymour and his New Flagpole

A colourful character from the turn of the century was Texada's first Justice of the Peace, Louis B. Seymour. In a 1959 article, local historian Bruce McKelvie relates the brief Texada history of this sturdy, walrus-moustached Englishman.

Seymour was "very proud of his judicial office" and, as first editor of the January, 1900 *Coast Miner*, he filled the newspaper with pro-British Empire opinion.

The Boer War (1899-1902) was raging and Irish Fenians were

rumoured to be planning a raid into Canada. Editor Seymour was concerned about the level of local patriotism. The most recent troubling incident occurred at the school when a public entertainment ended without the singing of the national anthem!!

"Being popular with the fair ones", Mr. Seymour set about organizing a "patriotic ladies' committee" to obtain a flagpole for the school. "The erection of a flagpole will atone" for the "serious breach of social etiquette," he reported in the newspaper.

In the accompanying photo the new flagpole is seen in front of the "Honeymoon Cottage" directly above the Van Anda wharf. This log cabin was offered in 1898 as Texada's first school by Harry and Olive Treat (Van Anda Copper and Gold Company) when they completed their new home (seen higher on the hill and still standing).

Mr. Seymour's official peace keeping duties were called upon in the previous month (Christmas 1899) when a drunken fellow - a furnace man at the smelter - "in an effervescent mood" threw his wife out the window.



Seymour organized a 6-man "posse" of special constables to arrest the husband "in the name of Her Majesty the Queen" and lock him up in a vacant building until sober.

Having insured the security of the British Empire on Texada, Mr. Seymour moved to Victoria shortly after to become a member of the Legislative Press Gallery.

Thanks to Bruce McKelvie who, as a young lad working at the newspaper, witnessed these events.


