

REPORT FROM THE CHAIR Gillies Bay Improvement District (GBID)

To all the workers and volunteers that helped the Texada Community get through the recent weather related events... THANK YOU !

Thanks to the GBID Volunteer Fire Department members and others who showed up to help deal with the flood at the clinic. Thanks also to GBID water operator Ken Taylor for his part in getting the sandbags in motion.

The flooding pointed out that there is some confusion around ditches, culverts and drainage on Texada. Some think that GBID is responsible for culverts and culvert maintenance in Gillies Bay. The only culverts that are GBID culverts are the one in front of the Thrift Store/works yard, and the one along Gillies Bay Road under the access road to the Chlorinator site. General rule of thumb on Texada... If the culvert crosses under a street or public road, the Highways contractor looks after it. If a culvert crosses under a driveway or access road, then the owner of the property it fronts on is responsible for installation and maintenance. In the case of the culvert on the driveway into the tennis court/clinic, the landowner is the Regional District. It appears that this culvert, several other "driveway culverts", and some highway culverts are undersized for severe weather events.

Texada has a long history of excellent local employees and volunteers stepping up and doing a great job. We often take them

NEW GBIS DATA PLANS

Last year, GBIS obtained Provincial funding to upgrade the GBTV cable system, and the funded part of the project is now complete. There were challenges along the way partly because of the tight timelines and supply-chain issues.

Adding Internet to the cable system will help GBIS offer better service both directly through the cable and by reduced congestion of the Wi-Fi bandwidth available. The Connected Coast Submarine Cable should arrive in Gillies Bay in about two years and then everyone can expect faster speeds. The underwater cable will feed directly into the GB cable system and will also connect by radio link to the Pocahontas tower for the Wi-Fi clients.

With more stable and faster connections, we can increase the data limits for all plans. Here are the new (*pre-tax*) rates for annual plans.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

There's a changing attitude at the Regional District (RD) regarding Improvement Districts (IDs), particularly where water systems are concerned.

In the past, IDs were considered "outside agencies" when applying for limited grant funding from senior governments. As such, grant applications from IDs were only considered if there were no RD projects needing funds.

And if an ID folded, the RD had a policy of refusing to take over any water system that was not upgraded. That left IDs in a Catch-22 situation: health standards required the upgrading but IDs had no means to raise the funds to do the work.

The recent experience with the Lund ID has changed all that. The Lund ID has dissolved due to a lack of willing trustees and is now in receivership. Like it or not, ownership of the not-upgraded water system has landed with the qRD.

Recently, both VAID and GBID applied for Community Works (CW) funds to do needed work on their water systems. While VAID did receive grant money a few years ago to bring its water to potable standards, more work is needed to replace old, leaky pipes. GBID needs funds to bring its water quality up to current health standards. Staff recommended denying both applications due to competing RD projects. However, I was able to convince a majority of directors that ID residents are RD citizens too, and the recommendations to deny funds to the IDs were defeated.

Two things have happened since. One, the RD will do a review of its policy regarding allocation of CW funds, and two, directors passed a motion I introduced to go to UBCM later this year. The motion reads: WHEREAS competition for limited Community Works funds allocated to regional districts is very strong,

AND WHEREAS water improvement districts have minimal options for grant funding to upgrade aging water systems and costs to upgrade aging water systems would be borne by regional districts if water improvement districts dissolve,

THEREFORE BE IT **RESOLVED** that UBCM ask the province for a one-time fund to bring all rural water systems operated by improvement districts into compliance with health regulations.

No decisions have been made regarding VAID's and GBID's funding applications so there remains the possibility that some funds can be allocated to our IDs over the next few months.

GARDEN CLUB

Gardens are not always a simple matter of planting seeds and watching them grow. This month, Shirley McCune shares her experiences.

My garden still has seed stocks for birds; that's how I feed them.

Lots of blooming Hellebores for colour, lime green lemon Cypress, Cyclamen and fat buds giving promise to spring! I love winter gardens at a time when we need a little cheer. I intersperse my edibles in-between evergreen miniature forest. Shades of blue grey from lavender and Pinus Cembre. Yellows from cypress, column boxwood, darks from yew and cedar. Heather mounds for early blooming. Kale and Swiss chard feed me through the winter.

However, not all is rosy in the garden. 2021 was the |Battle of the Bamboo. Fifteen years ago it was a quick deer-proof, privacy, a Zen feel. But... it turned into a bully! Creeping towards and into my neighbours' yards. A hoe worked in the front to rid this invasive plant, but in the back it was all manual labour. There was so much destruction. I lost so many mature plants and had to start over. As gardeners we are always redesigning and rethinking what we want in our world. Low maintenance and heat resistant plants using less water is what I am thinking now.

My Tourtiere

3 lbs ground pork or lamb
3 lbs ground beef
2 big onions
1 lg yam or potato
garlic to your taste
big red sweet pepper
All minced, grated or chopped fine.
1 teaspoon each: ground cloves, cinnamon,

5-spice or allspice, nutmeg, then add a little more of what you like

3/4 liter of chicken broth

salt and pepper to taste

Combine and simmer for about 2 hrs. Add 2 tbsp chia seeds or 1 tbsp of cornstarch to thicken. Roll pastry and cut circles for 5" aluminum

pie forms. Make little tops and freeze. Makes roughly 21 pies.

Bake 350 until golden brown.



MUSEUM MUSINGS John Antle and Texada's Columbia Hospital



When Tacoma Steel ceased its Marble Bay operations in 1907 Texada City's opera house was donated to Reverend John Antle's newly-established Columbia Coast Mission for use as a hospital.

Antle (1865-1949) was a rough and ready Newfoundlander

ordained in the Church of England and serving as a priest in Vancouver. He was alerted to the unmet needs of the people on BC's remote coast when, in 1904, the Union Steamship *Cassiar* arrived in Vancouver with four dead loggers aboard.

With a donation of \$100 from the Anglican diocese, Antle and his 9-year old son outfitted a 16-foot racing dinghy (the *Laverock*) with a "new-fangled" 3/4 horsepower gas engine. They embarked on a daring 800 km journey to assess the needs of the logging and mining camps, canneries, lighthouses, and First Nations villages upcoast.

Antle's forceful presentation of his findings resulted in the formation of the Columbia Coast Mission and the launching of the 60-foot ship *Columbia* in 1905. Captained by Antle, it was a floating dispensary, emergency ward, ambulance, chapel, and library.

The *Columbia* became a welcome visitor for upcoast residents who would step on board for ceremonies (weddings, christenings, funerals) or social events such as movies or visits with Santa.

CCM hospitals were established at Rock Bay, Alert Bay, Van Anda and (later) Garden Bay. Bishop Perrin of Vancouver opened Texada's hospital, which employed doctors Keith and MacDermott, and nurses Beatty and Franklin.

Their first winter of 1907/08 was a challenge when temperatures plunged. The

thirteen patients shared three hot water bottles while Dr. MacDermott thawed the pipes.

Van Anda's hospital often hosted Reverend Antle's successor — the energetic but inexperienced Alan Greene. The nurses taught the student missionary to help as an anaesthetist when in port.

Greene loved a practical joke. He slept in any vacant hospital beds — even the morgue — and was once mistaken for a corpse when several men entered at night to measure the body for a coffin. Greene moaned and sat up suddenly, causing the shocked men to bolt for the door!


Van Anda's hospital closed in 1920 and the CCM ceased its marine service in 1969.

A stained glass window in a Hamilton, Ontario church commemorates Antle's life work — bringing companionship, medical help, and inspiration to the lonely men and women of BC's coast.


