



### GARDEN CLUB NOTES

February already! Since we live in such a temperate zone, we are lucky to be enjoying some days out in our gardens. When we think of the garden, we usually think of dirt in which we plant, producing food, flowers, trees and shrubs. This month, Dale Leopkey is sharing how he has designed and built a Zen Garden, a garden beyond soil. This Japanese style garden is intended to represent the essence of nature and act as an aid to meditation to find the true meaning of existence. Okay, I had to look that up! Dale has a wonderful touch. Do walk down the Sanderson Beach trail that parallels Sanderson Road to see this special place. The fairy village is very close to Dale's Japanese Garden. He also had a hand in that!

My Japanese Garden

We still find ourselves surrounded by COVID! I am in need of a project and have rediscovered a book given to us by family, entitled "Japanese Gardens in a Weekend".

Why, might you ask, a Japanese Garden? Whenever we meet friends along the Sanderson trail or enroute to the Gillies Bay Store, the conversations always end up with the question, "How is your garden doing???" then must endure a long litany of complaints about weeds, wind, weather and water. A Japanese garden has none of these concerns. What, you may ask, is a "Japanese Garden"? The earliest historical reference to such a garden dates back to A.D. 74 (earlier in China). Later gardens were influenced by the rise of Zen Buddhism and it is now the standard for dry landscape style, (i.e. rock/gravel), used in Zen gardens of Japan today. Note: no weeds, no wind, no weather, no water worries.

A Japanese Garden has three basic zones: the fore, the middle and the background. The garden scene is built up in a series of layers that guide the viewer's imagination into revealing a delightful composition.

Current Status: My garden gate is complete and includes Marzie's tricycle wheel from the 1940's. Hopefully the gate will soon be open because a Japanese Garden is not complete without a viewer! You may have spotted this gate tucked into our laurel hedge

along Sanderson Trail. The Tea/Coffee/Bring Your Own Beer House is nearly complete. The garden perimeter is fixed. The Texada variation will feature not only rocks and gravel but also driftwood. These features are tentatively in place. However, at Marzie's insistence, I am in the process of relocating several tons of topsoil. This area will then be filled with sand and gravel. Currently, I have ten samples weathering on my deck. Hopefully I will decide on the most appropriate material soon.

Forget the Japanese Garden in a weekend, I started this project in October and do not expect to finish before Spring 2021. I believe that is about 24 weekends and should coincide nicely with the arrival of the COVID vaccine!

This spring, I hope to take a more active part in the Texada garden culture. I will be able to discuss with friends and neighbours my garden's progress and it will not include concerns about weeds, wind, weather or water.

**Karaage Chicken Recipe** 

This is one of my favourites and is also very popular in Japanese Isakaya [pub].

Ingredients:

- 1 lb chicken thigh [skin on] cubed
- 1 Tbsp sake
- 1 tsp sugar
- 2 Thsp soy sauce
- 1 Tbsp gråted ginger
- 1 clove minced garlic
- 1 half egg, beaten
- 1 third cup potato starch cooking oil for frying

Preparation:

- In a large bowl, combine chicken, sake, sugar, soy sauce, ginger and garlic. Mix well, cover with plastic and marinate in the fridge for at least 15 minutes.
- 2. Add the egg and potato starch to the chicken and mix well.
- 3 Heat oil to 340 F. and fry once for 5 minutes. Then fry a second time until golden brown—it's this double frying that gives this dish its unique crunchiness.

## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

While the camaraderie and connectedness of in-person gatherings is sadly missed during the pandemic, work is carrying on at the RD. Directors have both group and individual responsibilities. This month, I'll share some **insight into what I do as Texada's director.** For the time being, all meetings are virtual and are open to the public on the qRD website.

The Board itself meets at the end of each month to make decisions on recommendations from three standing committees. The Planning Committee involves directors from areas A, B, C, and D, which participate in the planning service, while Finance Committee and Committee of the Whole (which I chair) include all seven directors. The qRD Board also serves as the board of the PR Regional Hospital District, which meets regularly.

Directors also serve on other committees of the RD and I'm appointed to three. The Regional Emergency Executive Committee meets quarterly and deals with emergency management issues. The Social Action Planning Advisory Committee also meets quarterly and oversees implementation of the regional Social Plan, including issues such as housing, child care and poverty reduction. The ad hoc Regional Public Transportation Service Exploration Working Group focuses on the lack of public transportation in rural areas and bus service to the Lower Mainland. It will make recommendations this summer to the three local governments: the RD, PR City, and Tla'Amin Nation. Elected officials of these three bodies also try to meet quarterly regarding issues of mutual concern. Additionally, I'm the RD's rep on the Tourism PR Board, which meets monthly.

Closer to home, I sit as a non-voting member of Texada's Recreation Commission, Heritage Commission, and the Airport Advisory Committee.

Currently, I attend all of the above sitting in my crafts room with my laptop computer. While it's nice to be home right after the meetings, I greatly prefer the discussions and interactions of meeting in person.

The biggest issue this month is development of the 2021 budget and five-year financial plan. No big surprises so far, but costs are going up, so be prepared for a property tax increase. The final budget must be approved by March 31.

## MUSEUM MUSINGS LITTLE BILLIE MINE

Perhaps it's the romance of the name that spurs the imagination, but Little Billie is the most fondly remembered of old Texada mines.

As one of the oldest claims on the island (1880), the details of its discovery and naming are lost in time. Some say it was fishermen who made the initial find just above high tide line. We do know, however, that Alfred and James Raper, Texada's pioneer prospectors, later worked this claim from tents on the shore.

In 1896, American mining promoter Ed Blewett got wind of its potential and purchased the claim along with the Copper Queen and Cornell sites. With partner Harry Treat, the Van Anda Copper and Gold Company set to work.

Mine reports show that Little Billie's first ore shipment of 30 tons was sent to a smelter in Everett to extract the gold, silver and copper locked in the rock.

By 1919. when the mine closed due to falling copper prices, production had totalled over 36,000 tons.

Little Billie sat idle until 1943 when another smooth-talking American mining promoter, Lester Prosser, bought the claim. Remembered as a "figure of dash and colour", Prosser was a small, energetic man who thrived north of the border as, "for some reason", he was never able to return to the US.

With \$200,000 of his own money, Prosser set about to de-water and clean out the mine down to the 280-foot level.

Little Billie's reopening prompted a "spectacular revival" of Van Anda's for-



tunes. The *PR News* (May 1945) reported that, with its population swelling to over 1,000, "Van Anda is overcrowded." Two shifts employed at least 60 men. A work camp including cookhouse and offices was constructed (photo), all supplied by a diesel-powered electrical generator near the shore.

Lack of continued investment, however, forced Little Billie to cease operations in June, 1952. The camp was demolished and the cookhouse was moved into town to serve as the post office. The generator and power line system were bought by Al Waters to supply his new Van Anda electrical grid.

Today Little Billie sits silent — a jumble of rock, sagging timbers and lengths of abandoned pipe. Fortunately, Texada museum's walk-through Little Billie mine display rekindles the mystique of the historic site.
