As a part of the Phase 2 COVID-19 Immunization Plan rollout, Vancouver Coastal Health is holding a series of vaccination clinics on Texada Island. These clinics are open to seniors who are age 70+ and Indigenous peoples age 55+. To get a vaccination at this clinic, seniors should call 1-877-587-5767 to book.

To prepare for your call, please have available a pen and paper, personal health number, full name, date of birth, postal code and phone number. There are enough appointments available for all seniors and there is no rush to call in. Call volumes are lower in the late afternoon and evening. The appointment booking toll-free phone line is open from 7 am to 7 pm, seven days a week. When making the call, please say you are calling from Texada Island. #### COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINICS COMING TO TEXADA ISLAND!

There will be Covid-19 Vaccination Clinics scheduled for the residents of Texada Island on an ongoing basis, in accordance with the provincial vaccination schedule. Announcements will be made on the Facebook Texada Message Board, on local bulletin boards at the grocery stores/post offices and other public spaces, and, time permitting, in the *Express Lines*.

On the Sunshine Coast we are lucky to be able to vaccinate a wider range of ages due to our smaller population. On March 30<sup>th</sup>, April 1<sup>st</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>, the Texada Island Health Centre staff, aided by Public Health staff, volunteers, and the Gillies Bay Fire Department, are co-ordinating vaccination clinics at the Gillies Bay Community Hall. These clinics are by appointment only, from 10:30 am to 2 pm, for persons born in the year 1951 or earlier, and for indigenous persons born in the year 1966 or earlier. Please call 1-877-587-5767 to book your appointment. We anticipate the next age group will be vaccinated in the upcoming weeks as vaccines become available.

Thanks to all the Health Centre staff, Public Health Nursing staff at Powell River Hospital, and community volunteers for their assistance in making this service available to the residents of Texada Island.

On the day of your appointment:

- Check your scheduled appointment date, time, and location.
- Bring photo identification/BC health number with you.
- Please arrive on time for your appointment and avoid arriving early. This will help us follow public health guidelines, maintain physical distancing and keep everyone safe.
- Wear a short-sleeve shirt as the vaccine will be delivered to your upper arm.
- Dress in layers to stay warm as you may be required to wait outdoors to maintain physical distancing.
- You will be monitored for 15 minutes after receiving your vaccine.

## TEXADA COMMUNITY POLICING Hunting Stats 2020

The start of the fall season was quiet while the beginning of the antlerless season was the busiest Conservation has seen. Near the end of the season, two people were issued a warning for riding an ATV up Oak Street in Gillies Bay (a Motor Vehicle Act violation) and were ticketed for cocked crossbows on their backs (a Wildlife Act violation). As well, they could not produce their photo ID, were technically hunting in a closed area (cocked weapons near residences), and were heading to hunt on private property without permission.

There were 23 Wildlife Act case files opened by the COS from January 16, 2020 to January 30th, 2021. Eighteen cases were unique to the COS and all were hunting related except one (dogs chasing geese). Five violation tickets were issued, eight written warnings were issued, and two cases are still under investigation. There was one report of night hunting made to the RCMP in the early part of the season.

Two complaints were made to the policing committee from Van Anda. One,



also reported to the RCMP and Conservation, involved hunting in a closed area (Van Anda) with deer carcass remains left by the road. The other expressed concerns around the current rules regarding hunting distances from the road in the Slow Farm area adjacent to Van Anda as there has been a marked increase in new residents.

Please phone in all violations, hunting or otherwise. Without statistics, there is no evidence to base the level of support (patrols) needed to curb these activities.

### MUSEUM MUSINGS The Van Anda Sawmill

For the first part of the twentieth century, the Carter Brothers' sawmill at the outlet of Van Anda Creek was one of the town's best known landmarks (photo).

Passengers arriving at the Van Anda wharf would note the tall brick chimney and hear the screech of the steam-powered saw blades, a quite different scene from the tranquil one today.

Henry and John Carter bought the mill in 1899 from the Grant brothers of Comox who had run the mill for 20 years at a Cumberland coal mine. Along with it came George McLeod to help set up the operation. McLeod, however, was soon lured away by Texada's mineral possibilities and became a prominent island prospector.

The economic boom due to the mining activities caused a huge local demand for sawn lumber for houses, shops and for mine supporting timbers. In addition, nearby logging sites such as Lang Bay, Stillwater, and the new mill at Powell River needed lumber to build camps and houses.

Initially "Steamboat Bob" (Walter Pinnock) would tow the milled wood across Malaspina Strait with his driftwood-fuelled, steampowered boat, *Wood Nymph*. Later, Bill Young and Bill Kirkness rivalled for towing contracts.

With a sawmill close by, logging on Texada took off. Nearby trees were felled, some towed along the rocky shore by hand. The first log boom received by the mill was from Myrtle Point (350,000 board feet — one week's supply).

Fuel for the steam plant was supplied by Chinese labourers and others who cut 4foot cordwood and hauled it to the mill by horsepower.

The Carters enthusiastically joined community affairs, locating their house on the creek bank just upstream of the mill. John ran the mill while brother Henry acted as a mine recorder, helped establish the Texada Gun Club, served on the School Board, and became Justice of the Peace.

Before the mill closed in 1923, it is said that the very last load of lumber was floated around Texada to construct the first house in Gillies Bay — Dr Sanderson's.

With the economy slumping, the sawmill was eventually demolished, only its chimney remaining. It stood for years after as a reminder of the valuable enterprise that helped create Texada's boom times.

# **TIRC**

The Texada Island Recreation Commission (TIRC) recommended to qRD that the bleachers at the Gillies Bay and Van Anda ballfields be removed before they become hazardous at its December 2020 meeting. This recommendation was adopted by qRD and reaffirmed at TIRC's March 2021 meeting. It is expected that the Gillies Bay bleachers will be replaced later this year whereas the Van Anda bleachers may last another two years. After the bleachers are removed, other structures could be built or installed to increase the functionality of the ballfield recreational sites. ### **GARDEN CLUB NOTES**

April is here. That means the soil is warming up and we need to get ready for planting. Our guest writer this month is Anne Carney. She has lovely reflections on spring.

We have had a year in the garden with Covid-19; now it is spring again and a time of awakening for our gardens and our souls. Time to get dirty and cleanse our foggy minds. Time to stop thinking about Pfizer and Moderna and turn our attention to shallots and helianthus, plants to adorn our space this year. I began pulling weeds in January and February on those not too cold days when the sun shone. The first snow drops, croci and other bulbs were exciting, now I am checking for the first asparagus spears to emerge from the soil.

There were so many highlights of my garden last year, the peas were lush, I had a bumper crop of squash, everything seemed to thrive. My biggest pride came from the eggplant seedlings that I got from Wendy. In previous years I have had little success, maybe there was not enough heat. Last year they were beautiful, Traviata's deep purple skin complimented Beatrice's globes that shone like jewels in the sun. I was thrilled every time I walked by them. At the other end of the garden the sunflowers massed together to give a wall of golden and bronze hues. I am hoping for a repeat performance this year.

We don't know yet the path that Covid will take in future months; we do know that we can find solace and take strength from our gardens. The effort we put into them will be given back to us. Happy spring, happy gardening, and keep safe everyone.

My recipe comes from a book titled <u>Savour</u> by Peter Gordon. It has become a favourite of mine. Miso-baked Aubergine (eggplant)

- 3 Tbsp miso paste (I use shiro miso)
- 3 Tbsp mirin (or 2 Tbsp liquid honey)
- 2 Tbsp sunflower oil
- 2 Tbsp sesame oil
- 2 aubergine
- 1 Tbsp sesame seeds

I prefer to use the long oriental aubergine but other kinds work just as well; they just take longer to bake.

Trim the stems from the aubergine then cut them in half lengthwise. Lightly score the flesh in a criss cross pattern and put them in a baking dish cut side up. Mix the miso, mirin and oils into a paste. Brush the mixture onto the cut sides of the aubergine. Sprinkle with sesame seeds. Bake at 350 degrees until the flesh is incredibly soft, 25-30 minutes for small aubergine, up to an hour for the rounder types. Enjoy!

# **Director's Report**

**Your opinion please:** In response to issues including illegal camping, shellfish poaching, and the dumping of garbage/yard waste, RD staff are proposing putting gates on the roads to Howie's Dump and the Ponderosa in Shelter Point Park. Howie's (a former log dump) is accessed from the road leading down from the nature trail parking area and the Ponderosa runs off Mouat Bay Road to the beach.

What do you think? Please let me know by April 9 and your opinion will be included in materials for the RD Board,

sandynleeti@gmail.com. If you've already responded to my Facebook post, there's no need to do so again. If you want to write directly to the RD, the address is administration@qathet.ca. Please indicate that it is correspondence for Committee of the Whole.

Meanwhile, the qRD has signed on to the Connected Coast (CC) project which will bring high-speed internet access to 154 rural coastal communities. The \$47 million, 3,400-km sub-sea fibre cable will connect communities from Haida Gwaii-Prince Rupert to Victoria-Vancouver with a minimum 50/10 broadband speed.

The cable will circumnavigate Texada with "landing hubs" at GB and VA. Construction is expected to start later this year.

CC is a partnership between corporations owned by the City of Prince Rupert and Strathcona Regional District. Federal and provincial funding is being sought.

The sub-sea cable would become the backbone of the coastal network. Still to come are plans for "last mile connections," which will bring this internet connectivity from the hubs to your home or business. Consultants at Driftwood Communications are currently completing a Connectivity Plan for the qRD to address this issue.

The RD was also able to provide the GB Internet Society with a letter of support for funding for the upgrading of the GB co-axial TV cable to add internet connectivity.

Finally, the RD together with PR City and Tla'amin Nation has begun work on a Poverty Reduction Strategy and again, your opinions are being sought. Please complete a community well-being survey, aimed at gathering input regarding income-related experiences. The survey explores barriers and opportunities regarding poverty reduction. ### TEXADA CERAMIC AND Sculpture Studio Update

2020 was a difficult year for a newly created community group to be shut down. Despite having to close the studio for the majority of 2020, we have persevered and continued making improvements for our users. Through fundraising from the recyclables at the Van Anda Recycle Depot last year, we purchased a new digitally controlled ceramic kiln. We conducted the required test firings and it is now ready for use. Its digital programs make it versatile, ranging from a ceramic kiln to a glass fusing kiln. Thank you to everyone who chose to bring your recyclables to the local depots. We have now taken over collection from the Gillies Bay depot for 2021, meaning we will have more bottles to sort! A huge thank you to our volunteer members who continue to sort and deliver bottles, keeping themselves involved with the studio, even when we can't open the doors. During the year some of our users had taken home their clay and tools, and we have done some firings to keep up with stuff brought in. We all patiently wait until COVID is less concerning and we can resume operation of the studio. with weekly open sessions and classes to come.
