Here we go!! May 29^{th} will be our first market, held at the Gillies Bay ball field, 12 noon - 1:30 pm every Sunday until further notice.


Anyone wanting to be a vendor at the Market **must** contact me before showing up.

GARDEN CLUB NOTES

Everyone is invited to the Texada Garden Club's first in-person gathering since the start of COVID.

Wednesday, May 4, 2 - 4 pm at the Community Hall

We will be talking about what has worked well in our gardens during the last two years, what hasn't, and what we're doing differently this year. Some interesting ideas also will be presented. BYO refreshments and any extra seeds or seedlings you may have for a "seed exchange". Membership cards will be available at no charge due to missed meetings, valid until October. Card holders receive discounts at numerous nurseries.

This month's column is written by longtime TGC member Sandy McCormick about a local, edible wild delicacy, sea asparagus, which is only available during May and June.

Also called *salicornia*, which means salty horn in Latin, sea asparagus can be found in intertidal zones along North America's west coast including Texada. It looks like miniasparagus spears and is large enough to pick by early May. Harvest by late June, after which the stalks turn thick and woody and are not good to eat.

When picking, always cut the spears to not damage the roots. The spears will grow back quickly. However if you do remove some roots, they can be replanted at home in pots with sandy, well-drained soil. Water with ocean water.

Sea asparagus offers deliciously salty plant nutrients (such as vitamins A, B, calcium, and iron) without the ill effects of salty condiments. Its vivid green color and light crunch make sea asparagus a great addition to salads or snacks, cooked like beans or asparagus, in pastas, soups, stir-fries, frittatas or stews, as an accompaniment to fish, beef, pork, or chicken, deep fried in tempura batter or even pickled.

Because sea asparagus is naturally salty, after picking always soak for a minimum of two hours in fresh water which allows excess salt to leach out. Except when you're eating it raw, blanch for 30-45 seconds after soaking but before cooking. My favorite sea asparagus recipe is below.

Sandy's Stir-Fried Sea Asparagus

- 4 C sea asparagus, soaked and blanched
- 2 tbsp butter
- 3/4 C diced red pepper
- 1 C almonds
- 1/4 C diced garlic
- 2 mandarin oranges in sections

1/2 C maple syrup

Lightly brown garlic, red pepper and almonds in butter in a wok.

Add sea asparagus and mix. Add all other ingredients and mix well. Stir-fry on high for 2-3 minutes. Enjoy!



DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Were you as disappointed as I was at the responses from officials at the recent **Highways meeting**? Whether it's road grading, snow clearing, line painting, or removal of slashed plant materials, they said everything comes down to money. There just isn't enough to do the quality of work we'd like done.

While the RD has no authority over highways, I have followed up in two ways. One was speaking to our MLA, Nicholas Simons, who agreed to pursue our concerns provincially. The other was to meet with regional highways boss Michael Braun who committed to look into the leaving of slashed plant debris in ditches. Additionally, MOTI will replace the culvert at the clinic with a larger one.

Also regarding transportation, we have no **electric vehicle charging stations** (EVCSs) on Texada. Thanks to John Zaikow for pointing this out. Taking this to the RD, the Board passed a motion for a staff report about establishing EVCSs in rural areas. Also, staff were directed to seek grant funding opportunities to install two EVCSs on Texada. Where do you think they should be?

Continuing efforts to help improvement districts with water system up-

hikers have been doing much-needed trail

maintenance. Recent efforts have focused on

the Mt. Grant Loop and Priest Lake/Sword

Fern Trails, both of which have been cleared

of deadfall and remarked with flagging tape

as needed. Other hiking trails will be receiv-

ing similar treatment and additional volun-

teer help would be welcome. It is hoped that

The recent local government conference unanimously supported my motion to go to UBCM this fall, calling on Victoria for a new one-time fund to bring ID-operated water systems into compliance with health regulations. If there was ever an issue needing a silver bullet, it's this one.



Numerous testimonials have come forward from residents being discharged from the Emergency Department in the middle of the night without proper resources or the means to get home. The program would clearly identify Texadans and provide some basic necessities including clothing, hotel, and taxi vouchers. The program works very successfully in the southern Gulf islands.



Lou McKee spent summers on Texada as a child with a relative. She is the author of *Klee Wyck Journal: the making of a wilderness retreat*, c2017, 971.12 MCK. Lou returned to Texada in 2017 to give an author reading of her new book.

Meg Tilly is an actress, former ballet dancer, and writer, who spent her childhood on Texada Island. Meg wrote a young adults book *Porcupine*, c2007, YA FIC TIL.

Clement W. Yeo-West, a resident of Texada, is an author, musician and songwriter. His recent book is *Spirit Light*, c2021.

John Wood, our Van Anda Postmaster, and Alfred Muma, a local artist, released *Raven and the Salmonberry Rapture*, c2015, 398.2 RAV. The book contains 27 old Haida stories with paintings by Alfred Muma. Half the proceeds of the book went towards supporting Haida Language Programs.



MUSEUM MUSINGS Charles Anderson - Texada's Lucky Swede

Charlie Anderson was the most famous of Texada's gold seekers but his reputation was earned elsewhere and many details of his life remain a mystery.

Born in Sweden in 1859, Charlie left for

America in 1887 and was drawn to the Klondike gold rush ten years later. Charlie made his "grubstake" working his claim at Forty Mile Bar in the Yukon.

One night, however, he took a chance and blew \$800 buying the "worthless" Eldorado #29 claim from a pair of down-and-out miners. The chance paid off. He "struck it rich" earning his nickname "Lucky Swede".

Charlie left the Yukon shortly after and toured Europe with a million dollars and his new wife, Grace Drummond, a Dawson City dance hall girl.

Details are sketchy but it appears that Charlie paid \$50,000 to either marry her or to get rid of her (?). Another rumour says that she demanded her weight in gold to seal the deal.

With 31/2 coal oil tins full of gold dust, Charlie returned to San Francisco in 1899 and invested his remaining fortune in real estate (a turreted mansion and hotels). Unfortunately, he lost it all when his properties were destroyed in the 1906 earthquake and fire.

Some say he relocated to Texada immediately after, perhaps lured by stories of the fabled "lost gold mine" which he never found. Others say that he worked at Britannia mine and in Sapperton first.

Henry Liebich remembered his house on Smelter Avenue. Others say Charlie lived at Blubber Bay in a cabin on the Fogh property and took meals at Mrs Blanchard's. Joe Pillat remembered him working as a bull cook at the Alberta Logging camp in Gillies Bay in 1920.

A *Province* interview in 1925 commented on Charlie's "unusual energy" when he visited Vancouver at age 65 to buy fruit trees for his "little ranch on Texada".

Charlie with his pointy beard was remembered as a "ladies' man" by Marion Little. Always optimistic, he claimed his facial hair was to "keep away the girls" and vowed not to shave until he struck it rich again.

He never did. Charlie died in 1939. On his deathbed he mused, "I've got many good miles ahead of me."

His gravestone in Texada's Woodland Cemetery reads "Klondyke Pioneer."

REPORT FROM THE CHAIR Gillies Bay Improvement District (GBID)

We may have had a cool and wet spring, but that does not mean we should not be using our community water wisely.

Last year we saw record drought conditions. Those conditions enabled us to collect a lot of "worst case" data that will be invaluable in planning and predicting water usage. The data shows that our daily usage ranged between 162,000 and 543,000 liters per day during the summer.

We are currently finalizing plans for a new water treatment plan that will enable GBID to meet Canadian drinking water standards. It is much easier to properly treat the water if the water flow is fairly constant, and an even daily usage requires less treatment equipment. In theory, if we can even out the flow, we can lower the capital costs and the treatment costs.

Most residents understand good water management when watering. Stuff like watering only when it is cool, watering early in the morning or in the evening, and using soaker hoses or hand watering. In general, watering the plants and not losing our valuable water to evaporation.

In order to see if we, as a community, can even out the water flow rates and keep



water pressure stable, we are restricting watering a bit between May 15 and Oct 15 and attempting to keep it simple.

Watering hours are restricted to between 5 am and 9 am and 5 pm and 9 pm. So no sprinkling or watering between 9 and 5, day or night. Also new this year, we are asking even numbered properties to water only on even numbered days and odd numbered properties to only water on odd numbered days. This should be simple for us all to remember... Have a great summer, and we will let you know how it worked in the fall.
