Move Over

In 2019, I submitted an article "Every Second Counts" to the Express Lines. I was urging people to pull over and stop if an emergency vehicle is approaching with flashing lights and siren on. Maybe the tone was too polite since clearly many people didn't get the message. If an emergency vehicle is on route to an incident with flashing lights and siren on, move over — it's the law! We know with our narrow roads that is often not possible to pull over, but you can always stop. This applies to situations where the emergency vehicle is catching you from behind, as well as when it is meeting you.

We don't use our lights and sirens when practicing, or when we are just in transport mode. When they are on it is because dispatch has advised that the incident we are responding to is an emergency. So instead of adding to the problem, help us respond as quickly as possible to the emergency. Thank you.



REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

Gillies Bay Improvement District (GBID)

It is no secret that Gillies Bay water is neither what it should be nor what it could be. This time of year is the worst. We all have come to expect that the community will be put on boil water advisories by Vancouver Coastal Health at some point during the summer. That is the way it is and that is the way it will be until we get better water treatment in place. The issue has been studied to death, and the GBID trustees have a plan to fix it.

We have applied for a multimillion dollar grant to help cover the costs. The grant application has passed the first hurdle. We expect a decision on the application early next year. In the meantime, we are working on necessary items that are not covered by the grant as well as further refining and

costing our options. Once we have a decision on the grant, we will host one or more community town hall meetings to present and discuss all aspects of the proposed treatment system. With or without the grant, we still have to act. No final decision will be made without the approval of the Gillies Bay rate-payers. The water system belongs to all the landowners of Gillies Bay, sort of like a co-op. The Board of Trustees is just that, a group of volunteers entrusted by the community with looking after the co-op. We cannot do it alone and as we move along will be asking for the support of the community to finally fix the water!



DIRECTORS REPORT

Last month's column focused on island issues I've contributed to as Texada's regional director. *This month is a look ahead* as this term of office winds down. This includes both unresolved, on-going issues and new initiatives.

Still needing resolution are applications by GBID and VAID for gas tax funding for water system upgrades, protecting Mt. Davies should Lasqueti choose 911 service, access to high-speed internet for all Texadans, expansion of Emily Lake Park and protection of Stromberg Falls. Two other unresolved issues I initiated are allowing volunteers in parks and installing public electric vehicle charging stations on Texada.

In August, a new unresolved issue emerged related to Texada Rescue (TR), operated by VAVFD including a rescue vehicle with the jaws-of-life. Taxes of \$15,000 are collected annually from all area D taxpayers for TR. Recently, TR requested a budget increase for equipment, tools and training. Because the existing TR bylaw already taxes the maximum allowed, a new bylaw would be needed. The cost of legal fees for the new bylaw were taken from TR's existing budget reducing its operating revenue for 2022 to \$4,000 from the \$13,500 that was expected. TR had no advance warning that such a reduction could happen and didn't know its budget was reduced until the cheque arrived.

This lack of communication concerns me greatly. Efforts are being made to provide TR with financial assistance, but I don't want to see any other community group left out of the information loop the way TR was. There's nothing in the RD's procedures bylaw which says that staff have to notify community groups when unanticipated budget reductions occur, but in the inter-

ests of courtesy and just plain common sense, there should be. I've asked that this issue be included in the next strategic planning session, after the Oct. 15 local government elections.

So what about the future? Two initiatives I'll be pushing for are an organized **Texada trails group**, which could receive RD funding for trail maintenance and signage, the way a mainland group does. And I'll be pushing for a wider range of housing on the island, including seniors, small accommodations and rentals.

As Texada's regional director, I've been humbled and inspired by the opportunities to help people, protect our land and preserve our island lifestyle. With your support, I'll continue to do so for the next four years.

Neighbours Helping Neighbours

Thank you to all of those who attended our meeting on Saturday August 6, 2022. Some great ideas came out of all of this that I would like to share.

For those of you living on your own, here are some tips that could help in the event that you find yourself injured or requiring immediate medical attention when there is no one around to assist you:

- Introduce yourself to your nearest neighbour.
- Set up a signal with your neighbour whereby they would know when or if you need help. It could be as simple as a certain curtain being drawn everyday, a plant moved on your deck/porch, or a sign on your door that says "welcome" put out each day.
- If you are comfortable with your neighbour, let them know where they can find a spare key to your dwelling. This would allow them access to you without involving the emergency people having to break into your home in the event you need medial assistance.
- Arrange to phone a designated person every day at a set time so that if you don't call they will know to check on you.
- If you are not comfortable with a neighbour checking on you, consider wearing a medical alert button so people are notified immediately if you have a fall or you are not feeling well.
- Put a list on your refrigerator with names and phone numbers of family members.

Let's not hear of anyone not receiving medical assistance because no one was aware of their situation! If you are aware of a vulnerable senior, introduce yourself and see if they would like to set up a system with you so you know they are okay. Share your ideas with other friends and neighbours and get them involved in caring for the vulnerable people in our community.

At the meeting there was a surge in interest in organizing a Seniors' Meet once again. You will be hearing more about this in the future as there is a lot of interest shown by volunteers to participate in getting this going.

Greetings, everyone.

The Book Sale is over for another year. Thank you to the generosity of residents and visitors for their support. A huge thanks to the wonderful volunteers who helped with setup and takedown.

"A 'Ghostwriter' is a person who writes on behalf of the credited author of a work."

Some of the best examples are those authors who have continued the series created by author Robert B. Parker, who wrote in the Mystery and Western genre.

Mr. Parker passed away in 2010. He was such a prolific writer! He created the memorable characters of "Spenser" (named after the English Poet), Jesse Stone, Sunny Randell mystery novels, and Cole & Hitch western novels.

Robert wrote 40 Spenser novels. Some were made into TV movies with the main character played by Robert Urich and Joe Mantegna. The Texada Library has five Spenser novels and one western novel, *Brimstone*. Michael Brandman produced the series and collaborated with Parker on the Spenser movies. After Parker's death, he wrote *Killing the Blues*, a Spenser novel. Ace Atkins has ghost written ten of the Spenser novels up to and including 2022.

Another famous Parker character is Jesse Stone. The Jesse Stone novels were also made into TV movies, with Tom Selleck playing Sheriff Stone of Paradise, Massachusetts. The Jesse Stone TV series was filmed in Nova Scotia, which represents Massachusetts. The library has eight of the nine Jesse Stone DVDs. Author Reed Farrel Coleman has taken over writing the Jesse Stone novels.

Mike Lupica has written some Sunny Randall and Jesse Stone mysteries. Robert B.

Parker's legacy continues.

The author himself can choose ghostwriters in his will or the author's family/estate will make the



decision. In Parker's case, it was his estate and his publishers who decided to continue his series.

MUSEUM MUSINGS OLIVE'S VAN ANDA DIARY... 1897

Harry and Olive Treat's first trip together to Texada in 1897 must have been filled with excitement and anticipation for the newlyweds as they arrived on strange island shores.

Excerpts from Olive's Van Anda diary (now held in Virginia Tech's Special Collection) were recently shared thanks to former Texada resident Budd Arnold who visited the museum this summer.

Wealthy east coast socialite Olive Graef was 27 years old in 1896 when she married handsome Harry Treat, a smooth-talking Chi-

cago lawyer. Embarking on their honeymoon by train, their Texada connection was forged during a chance encounter with Ed Blewett who persuaded them to invest in his Van Anda Copper and Gold mineral properties.

Harry had chosen the right woman for his bride. Although Olive was featured in Vogue magazine's 1894 Fair Women from Vogue portraits of "some of the attractive women who adorn the social life of our foremost cities", she proved to be a sturdy and adventurous companion.

Olive wasted no time getting to know Texada. She states that she went deer hunting and helped Ed Blewett stake claims. Her diary entries tell of hiking to the mines and descending via rope bucket and ladders. Harry writes: "No other woman would have had the courage. The miners all think the world of her."

She visited Mr Chung the Chinese "overseer", finding him "respectful and hospitable". Olive states they talked for an hour and shared "two bottles of Pommery" and "Chinese nuts".



Another entry tells how the newly-weds watched the felling of the "great trees" near the wharf at the site they had chosen for their "Honeymoon Cottage".

That log cabin seemed aptly named. Their diary entries express a great affection for each other. Harry writes: "I know her. I worship her. I love her." Olive adds: "Kim (Harry) is awful sweet to me."

Olive's last Texada entry tells of leaving on April 22 for Vancouver aboard the Union Steamship *Comox*. Though the couple eventually relocated to their

Seattle mansion, Olive retained a fondness for life on Texada and returned in summers to visit friends. "I like the life in my log cabin... one must have a breathing spell," she wrote later.

Personal diaries such as this one help us put a human face on the past.

GARDEN CLUB NOTES

Barbara McLean is the author of this month's article. She shares with us some interesting Texada Island history.

I consider myself extremely lucky to be living on one of the oldest homesteads on Texada. Established in 1912, our farm house was built, the land cleared, and many fruit trees planted by hard-working folk of Swedish descent. 110 years later, we are still enjoying the harvest from apple, pear, plum, and cherry trees. I have tried to imagine how many tons of fruit those harvests represent over time. Last year there were so many cherries I had to borrow a cherry pitter. Half of one whole freezer is devoted to apple and pear sauce to enjoy all winter long on hot breakfast cereal.

Unfortunately, this year we had a tent caterpillar infestation which cleared the foliage from a lot of the trees. But we will still have some fruit to harvest. These pests come in cycles and we were definitely due for a visit. We had out the sprayer and the BTK (a solution that you spray on deciduous trees to kill caterpillars). It's quite a battle.

One of my favourite desserts to make when the plums are in season is called Kuchen. The recipe is from the *Tassajara*

Bread Book. It calls for peaches but those purple-skinned yellow-flesh Italian prune plums make the best kuchen.

It is described as a peach (plum) mosaic set in custard with a sweet crust.

Kuchen

Serves 2-12

1/2 cup butter
2 cups flour
1/4 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
2 TBS. sugar
15 plums or 12 peaches, cut in half
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 cup sugar (I use less)
1 cup heavy cream or sour cream
2 whole eggs

Cut butter into flour, baking powder, salt, and 2 Tablespoons sugar with a pastry cutter until it looks like a coarse meal. Press firmly into the baking pan. Round is pleasing to the eye. Arrange peaches or plums on the surface (cut side down) to cover. Sprinkle fruit with a mixture of cinnamon and remaining sugar. Bake for 15 minutes at 400. Pour egg beaten with cream over top, and bake 40 minutes longer at 375. Really beautiful and a crowd pleaser for sure!
