TEXADA HEALTH SERVICES SOCIETY AGM REVIEW

Changes to the Clinic

As there were several people who were not able to attend the meeting, I have been asked to provide an update on the meeting. Firstly, we do have a doctor coming to replace Dr. Kevin Black at the end of June. She has acquired her property, and we are waiting for her to complete the finalization of documentation with Vancouver Coastal Health before they can formally make the announcement. But everything is progressing in a positive manner.

Secondly, we were very excited to have both Michelle Hanna, and Nova Cleghorn from Vancouver Coastal Health at our meeting. They discussed the upcoming changes coming to our clinic. The plan is to ensure that our nurses are train to provide additional services. It is expected that with the new doctor, both the doctor and the nurses will be able to work as team, so if the doctor is not available the nurses would be able to handle the patient's needs.

There are changes coming to the current computer system at the clinic. The clinic is on a Wi-Fi system that is independent of the system used by Vancouver Coastal Health (VCH). The VCH system will be directly connected to the clinic and will not be subject to the ups and downs of the Wi-Fi. This system will allow for other doctors who you see to access the information put in by clinic (including blood work, x-rays, etc.) without you having to repeat your medical history. It will also allow you to have a visit with specialist via zoom/team without leaving the island. The system will also allow you to access the results of your own blood work, x-rays, MRIs, etc. online. Currently, everyone in B.C. has this access.

For those new individuals who have recently moved to our lovely island and are having difficultly in seeing Dr. Black, the clinic has now created a waiting list. If you need a doctor sooner there is a Primary Care Priority Referral Form that can be accessed in Pathways and can be filled out securely online through MS Forms. Also, to print the form for filling out by hand and faxing, visit https://bit.ly/hcrpriority to download a PDF. If you don't have access to a computer, then I would ask the staff at the clinic to download a form for you.

This year, we are searching for some new volunteers to serve on our board, as many of our current volunteers, including myself are experiencing health issues due to our age. If you, or if you know someone that would like to serve on the Texada Health Services Society, please contact me at 604-223-7494. It is a very important and worthwhile society, without it Texada would not be where it is with the clinic and the various support systems we provide.



He loved to have deep, philosophical conversations about life, and was always asking questions, trying to know as much as he could about anything that crossed his path. He taught himself many of the skills necessary for a successful life off grid and in the bush; plumbing, electrical, mechanics and carpentry. He was proud of his independence and ability to build up the life he loved.

Keith spent the last 20 years as the caretaker of Mouat Bay, milling wood, running Joan the backhoe, and working in his wood shop. He was an incredible mentor and teacher to many and generously shared his wide array of knowledge and skills.

He enjoyed his solitude, but was very invested in helping out the people he loved, and wanted to help make their lives better. There are many people in his close circle who would not be where they are right now if it was not for all of his help. He would often drop his own projects and put things off when he knew a friend was struggling. Even in the last year, as he went through a serious health battle with cancer, he kept showing up with tools in his hand, and brilliant suggestions for fixing any problems.

Keith faced his cancer diagnosis with an optimism that never wavered, and lived out his last days exactly as he wanted to, surrounded by love and laughter.

Keith was hilarious, his sense of humor and quick wit stayed with him right until the end. He carved his own path into this life, and imprinted many people's hearts. He will be greatly missed by many, but I am happy he was at peace and was looking forward to his own evolution.

A celebration of life will be held **Saturday April 13th at Shelter Point at 3pm.** Please bring a potluck dish to share if you can, or a plant to get planted over the spot where his cats have been buried and his ashes will get spread at Mouat Bay.

Here are some notes from our last meeting, held March 13th

WATER LINE REPAIRS: A substantial leak on Earl St. resulted in our Water Treatment Plant going into alarm in the wee hours of the morning. A special THANK-YOU to Sylvia Praught and Ken Soles whose assistance and knowledge are very much appreciated. One leak on Columbia St. has been repaired and more require attention. Several other suspected leaks are under investigation and are being scheduled for repairs. A huge THANK-YOU goes out to the residents that advised us of water leaks. It makes a big difference to the whole system.

WATER QUALITY: The Water Quality Advisory continues. Specialized technicians have been to our Water Plant. More follow-up is required. Vancouver Coastal Health reports no issues from the monthly water testing. Test results are posted in the window of our office at the Fire Hall.

MEETINGS: The next Regular Board meeting is scheduled for Wednesday April 10th 1:30pm at the Fire Hall. The Annual General Meeting is scheduled for Saturday April 20 at the Legion. We are inviting community members to join us prior to the start of the AGM. The intent is to have a look at maps, drawings and photographs of water system repairs and installation. Perhaps you will be able to help us identify what we are looking at.



Well, as luck would have it, the mining co. had tasked me with the job of putting on a pair of slickers and crawl into that narrow cave to have a look around and report back. Being a bit apprehensive and down on my belly I crawled, the cave measured about four feet across and three feet high, rock hammer, flashlight and sample bag in my hands I made my way in to about thirty feet. The limestone had a few small stalactites hanging from the cave but what had me the most curious was this sheet shaped structure hanging from the roof up ahead... as I neared it I could make out this clump of wires running through it. Oh my goodness, it was all gold.

When I crawled back outside with the treasure there was excitement to say the least. Within a week the company had set up a diamond drill above the cave and a drill program had started. As the drill helper, I got to look at the drill core as I emptied it into the core boxes for examination. On the second drill hole we hit it. There was a two foot section of marble, as white as snow, laced throughout with quartz and ribbons of gold. To this day I've never seen the likes of something like that. The company owners, Jon Stewart and Warren Geiger used that precious show piece of core to raise funds to build the mine mill that's now owned by Zyrocs and undergoing renovations on Crescent Bay road. There are treasures still to be had for the brave and diligent souls of Texada who venture out with a keen eye and rock hammer.

Garden Club Notes

On Wednesday, April 17th, the Texada Garden Club will meet at the Senior Center in Gillies Bay starting at 2pm. Dorothee Kieser, lead mentor for the Master Gardener certificate program offered from VIU, will give a talk on how to grow vegetables. Do dress in layers as we have the doors and windows open for good ventilation. As always we will have masks and hand sanitizer for you to use. Non-members are always welcome too!

This month Sandy McCormick writes about edible flowers. Everyone loves the bright colors and wonderful fragrances of flowers, but did you know that many flowers can be eaten? Edible flowers have been enjoyed in food for centuries, adding flavor, color and beauty to dishes. Most are easy-to-grow, low-maintenance plants which add beauty and attract pollinators to your garden. Avoid eating flowers picked from roadsides or from stores as they could have been sprayed with chemicals. The following are some delicious additions to your menu which can be grown here on Texada:

Nasturtium – Easily the most recognizable edible flower which I first ate while visiting Texada in the 1980s. The plant's bright, peppery-tasting blossoms bloom for months. Awesome in salads. Save the seeds for planting or as a peppery substitute for capers.

Roses (domestic and wild) – Petals are delicate with flavors ranging from sweet to spicy. The darker the petal, the more intense is the flavor. Freeze petals in ice cubes, add to chutney, crystallize with sugar to decorate cakes or sprinkle over ice cream.

Lavender – This pungent, perfumed flower is intensely sweet. Uses include cakes, biscuits and teas.

Pansy – Cooler-weather, multi-colored flowers with a sweet baby lettuce taste. Garnish cakes, cupcakes, cheeses, salads.

Borage – Blue and white star-shaped flowers with a light cucumber flavor. Use with sweet or savory dishes.

Marigold/Calendula – Orange to golden-colored annuals. Petals have a tangy, yet buttery taste. Use with salads, asparagus, teas.

Yucca – Succulent white flowers, slightly sweet. Can be deep-fried in batter. Delicious with eggs..

Dahlia – Tubers can be eaten raw or cooked. Peel first. Celery-like flavor which sweetens when stored.

Other edibles from the flower garden include petunias, cornflowers and honeysuckle. Edible blossoms can also be found in the veggie patch. Kale, broccoli and arugula flowers are yummy in stir fries. Squash flowers (robust flavor) can be batter-fried or stuffed and baked. Edible herb flowers include chamomile, mint, thyme, oregano, dill and chives.



MUSEUM MUSINGS WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Texada's place names reveal the history of this fabled island.

Since ancient times the First Nations have called it Sah-yeh-yeen.

In the 18th Century European explorers imposed their own culture. The flavour of Spain is captured in the names bestowed upon the area by Captain Narvaez in 1791 - Favada, Lasqueti and Texada itself. Captain Vancouver (1792) introduced English into the mix naming Upwood Point after a childhood friend, for example.

Of course, people initially identified places based on their natural features. Crescent Bay, Long Beach, Shingle Beach, Shelter Point.

Early industries contributed to local names - Limekiln Bay, Blubber Bay, Marble Bay, for instance.

Some pioneer families lent their names to various geographical features - Van Anda (Carrie Blewett's family name), Sturt Bay (Captain Sturt's marble quarry), Priest Lake (after prospector Elijah Priest), Stromberg Falls, Kirk Lake, Erickson's Beach, Emily Lake, etc.

Some names have little directly to do with Texada's history. Mouat Bay is named for a Hudson Bay Company fur trader who operated through Hawaii. Harwood Point is named for a WWII British commander. Partington Point honours a captain whose ship exploded near Bella Bella in 1925.


The name of Pocahontas Bay always seemed out of place as it references a legendary American folk hero of the 1600's. Upon research, however, one finds that Pocahontas was the name of a ship that carried lumber on the west coast. Commanded by Captain Cyrus Sears (of Balti-

more) it became famous for transporting a 175-ft Douglas fir spar around the Horn to London for the Crystal Palace Exposition of 1851.

Of course some local names may never appear on any official map - "Break-Your-Ass-Hill" for example. And who can guess the origins of names like Rumbottle and Whiskey Still Creeks?

Perusing place names on the map of Texada Island opens another window into its colourful past.







DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A healthy community has sufficient housing types, sizes and prices to meet the needs of all residents, regardless of income, age or ability. I'm working with other qRD directors to help ensure future Texada Islanders live in such a community.

Building on the housing gaps identified in the recent regional housing needs assessment, the qRD has adopted policies to encourage a full range of housing options. Strengthening the rental housing supply is a priority. With a very low rental vacancy rate (1.7 per cent) and 77 per cent of all housing in the rural qRD being owned, there's a strong need to enhance the supply of stable long-term rental accommodation.

On Texada, secondary suites have always been legal and now they're accepted throughout the region. Accessory buildings for housing are also now allowed everywhere (except in the ALR) where provincial water and septic requirements are met. This includes mobile homes, tiny homes and RVs.

The qRD is supporting through grants and staff time the work of non-profit societies to develop new housing, including our TINSHS, Lifecycle Housing Society south of town and Housing Hope Society in PR.

Additionally, the RD is working with BC Transit to improve transit service in rural areas. Texada's long-awaited second day of community bus service is scheduled to start this year. Sonce Covid and the popularity of working from home, the need for reliable, quality high-speed internet is critical to attract and retain residents. The qRD supports universal connectivity in the region and joined the Connected Coast undersea fibre-optic cable project to make this happen.

Our island population is going to grow, whether we like it or not. Our Official Community Plan provides a great road map going forward. Provisions include:

- -Adapt to change and ensure access to appropriate, affordable and safe housing for all ages.
- -Encourage higher density residential development in VA and GB where water servicing is available
- -Encourage the development of affordable housing (including seniors housing) to meet the community's needs
- -Support secondary suites in single-family dwellings as affordable rental accommodation, and
- -The maximum number of dwellings per serviced lot is determined by meeting provincial water and septic requirements.
