Happy August everyone! Hope you are all enjoying the summer months and taking advantage of our Kids Don't Float life jacket loan station down at Shelter Point. Keep the kids safe on the water.

Last month we had a presentation on Fraud from RCMP officer Cst Perry. We had some great take aways about keeping ourselves safe from Fraud including these points -

- * If they ask you to pay by Gift Card it's 100% fraud. No government agency, including the CRA, police, hospital, utility company or anyone accepts gift cards as payment. Please do not comply. No matter how convincing, or urgent they make it sound! * If they claim to be someone you know who is in trouble, ask questions only they would know the answer to, to confirm who they are. Even if they claim to be abroad and need money urgently. Hang up and call them back. Nothing, even urgent hospital care needs payment immediately. Also, see point one!
- * If they pretend to be from a government agency or other, but threaten you or try and rush you. It's a fraud, Hang up. If you are concerned, call the relevant agency back directly, using a number you know to be real. Do not call them back on a number the caller provides. It would likely link back to the fraudsters.
- * If they are asking for personal info, especially when they cold call or cold email you, it's likely a fraud. Don't give over info such as your SIN, passport numbers, driving license number, health number or banking and credit card info.
- * If they are rushing you. If they are creating a sense of urgency to convince you into handing over money or info. It's likely
- * If they get angry with you for being cautious. It's fraud. A genuine caller will not mind you asking questions or taking your time.

In summary. If in any doubt. Hang up. You don't have to be polite. You can report these incidents to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC) online or by calling 1-888-495-8501. And please report any fraud you have been victim to, to the local RCMP. Don't be shy. We won't stop them without reporting it!

GILLIES BAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

SLOW SAND FILTRATION

Our drinking water source, Cranby Lake, has unique features concerning water quality, especially turbidity and seasonal changes. We are proposing the slow sand filtration process to purify drinking water and comply with Coastal Health requirements.

Slow sand filtration works PRIMARILY through biological activity that takes place on the surface of the sand bed; this biological layer is called the SCHMUTZDECKE (a german word). It is used today in some large cities such as London and Copenhagen but is mostly found in smaller systems; attractive to places like Texada due to low construction costs, low operating costs, low maintenance costs, and low energy costs.

Long time Gillies Bay residents will remember that about ten years ago the improvement district ran a pilot project to prepare for slow sand filtration, unfortunately we have insufficient data, especially the crucial summertime data, to be confident of success. Pilot study is always recommended to test the source water. Our pilot project is expanding to test different sand characteristics, especially testing for local sand sources. It may take more time but we are making every effort to maximize performance and safety of this proposed system.

There is lots more information on the internet. The wikipedia site offers a good overview without most of the technical numbers.

On a more immediate note: the beaver that has been causing recent water turbidity has been trapped.

TEXADA HISTORICAL FUN FACTS

DID YOU KNOW

The first forest fire lookout station in Canada (1924) was atop Mount Pocahontas. Jim McKimmie unloaded his horse cart and carried supplies up the rocky trail to the cabin, quite a feat for someone who had lost a leg in an industrial accident!

Texada's first "water taxi" (1903) was the *Wood Nymph*, a steam-driven vessel operated by an Englishman named Walter Pinnock (Steamboat Bob). It was not unusual for Walter to pull up on beaches mid-voyage to collect enough driftwood fuel to complete the trip!

The huge bulk ore carrier MV Texada was specially built in 1966 at the Yokohama ship yards to transport Texada's iron ore shipments to steel mills in Japan. It carried the largest cargo ever to be loaded at a BC port at that time.

Getting to Gillies Bay was not easy in the past. Travelling on the rough trail from Van Anda (later, a wagon road) took most of the day. Years later steamship travellers arrived at a simple float anchored in the bay, followed by a rowboat ride



ashore. Disembarking was not a pleasant event in stormy weather! In the 1960's much of Van Anda was perpetually covered in fine white dust. The "Whiterock Mill" across from the government wharf was the culprit. The historic smelter site (1898 - 1919) had become a crushing plant producing rock for stucco.

Rail lines on Texada were once a common thing. Marble Bay tramway (1/2 km to Sturt Bay) rivalled Cornell Mines' 2 km rail line from Emily Lake to the Van Anda dock. BC Cement later installed almost 5 km of rail line at its Blubber Bay operations. In the 1950's Texada Mines used an extensive underground rail network as well.

Everyone woke up to a surprise one morning in December, 1956, when they discovered that Texada Mines' 500-foot wharf and loading dock were missing! The pilings rested on slippery tailings mixed with clay and the tidal pressure of a 60mph gale was enough to push it under in the night.



DIRECTOR'S REPORT

"Board-on-the-road" is coming to Texada this month.

There's a long-established tradition at the qRD to hold the August board meeting in one of the electoral areas. This year it's our turn. On Aug. 28, two qRD meetings will take place in person on Texada: Committee of the Whole (which I chair) in the morning and the board meeting in the afternoon.

You are cordially invited and are most welcome to attend one or both meetings. You know who I am, come and put faces to the other names on the gRD Board.

FYI, most of the debate on issues takes place at one of three RD committees: Finance, which deals with financial matters, Planning, which deals with planning and development issues, and Committee of the Whole, which considers everything else. Board meetings are a second look at issues and provide an opportunity for new information to come forward before final decisions are made.

The Aug. 28 board meeting will consider recommendations from Planning and Finance Committee meetings earlier this month. Recommendations from Committee of the Whole will go to the board meeting in September for final approval.

August 31 is the firm deadline for the second of two rounds of applications for qRD grant funding in 2024. Over the last few years funding streams have been consolidated into two: general grant-in-aid (GIA) and area GIAs to streamline and add flexibility to the application process. Area GIAs are for initiatives that primarily benefit only one area, while general GIAs are for projects or events more regional in nature.

Area D started 2024 with \$24,516.21 in our area GIA budget and after considering the first round of grants, there's \$3,939.79 left for round two. General GIA funding (financed by everyone in the region) started at \$96,000 with \$10,112 remaining.

Texada groups receiving funding in round one are TINSHS (\$25,000), TACT (\$12,000), Sandcastle (\$3,000), the Legion (\$3,289 for parking lot lights) and Wild Ocean Whales Soci-

ety (\$2,000 for the Texada feral cat initiative). We also contributed with other areas to regional initiatives including PRISMA, qathet Film Society and Townsite Jazz Festival.

Wolverines!

The white land laid before me stark and frozen when I arrived in a Beaver on skis at Tara Lake. I was to build a camp for the summer's Yukon exploration and drill program. The kitchen would be the first of the buildings to construct as it would serve as temporary sleeping, eating and radio shack while I constructed camp. Supplies and a plywood building 12'X12' had been set in place in preparation the past summer were now 8 feet under snow and ice. The orange tarped peak barely visible above the snow.

The shack was 200 feet up from the lake. I had dug a stairway down 8 feet through snow and ice until I hit permafrost and the busted in front door. Something had eaten the fridge. Canned butter, beans and beef had been chewed and spit out like old spent chewing gum. The inside was a mess. A great welcome as the kitchen construction began.

I had built a burn pit at the base of an old dead stunted spruce tree. Every other day I would light a fire and burn the accumulated packaging, wood scraps and kitchen waste. One day as I headed over in my snowmobile to the pit for another burn, out jumped a threatening wolverine from the far side. I revved the engine loud... it didn't move. I jumped the snowmobile a few feet to the right... the wolverine jumped a few feet to its right. I jumped again... it did the same. Around and around we went neither of us giving up ground... it had declared the pit his prize. That's the one thing about wolverines, they'll defend what's theirs to the end. I was content to leave it a draw and let it rest for another day.

I had stored my frozen meat in the carved out snow just outside the kitchen door. One evening, having to go relieve myself, I opened the kitchen door and there three feet away I stood face to face with a pair of snarling wolverines helping themselves to my frozen meat. It was them or me. I quickly slammed the door shut and headed for my rifle.

Some days you could wear a tee shirt, other days the temps could drop to minus fifty and be four seasons in one day. I look back with fond memories and remember still the dancing Arora Borialus in full display over the campfires in Septembers past. Glory be the North and the not so innocent days of my youth.

News From the Library

Greetings Everyone.

History of the Texada Island Library cont'd:

Upon closure of the Iron Mine in 1976 the Bunkhouse was sold to the Gillies Bay Community and District Association for \$1.00. The Gillies Bay Library then became the Texada Library. In 1977 the Association voted to take on sponsorship of the Library. They promised to get the deed of the Library from International Kaizer Corporation. In 1979 permission was granted by the Regional Board to remove the existing Library building to the grounds of the Community Hall, thereby removing it from private land.

In 1987 the Library moved into its current location in the Gillies Bay Old School Building. The Gillies Bay Improvement District leased the building from the Powell River School District.

Eventually the lease for the library space was between the Gillies Bay Improvement District and the Powell River Library Association. The cost of the lease was \$600.00 per annum.

In a note dated March 9, 1994 the Powell River Public Library Association states that they supplied Texada Library with 150 - 200 books every month. The Texada Library owned approximately 1,000 books, plus many discards from Powell River. The Powell River Public Library Association paid \$1,050.00 per annum towards the Texada Library hydro bill.

Fire Departments urge caution

Hard to believe that anyone doesn't know the wildfire hazard level is extreme right now. The little bit of rain we had barely penetrated the duff (upper layer). It did nothing to alieviate the drought conditions. Also, since it was accompanied with lighting strikes it heightened anxiety levels for fire fighters for a while. But the reality is that in our area most of the danger comes from human activity, not lightening. All but one of the 63 fires to date in the Coastal fire zone were suspected human caused. Our Fire Departments are preparing for wildfire. Recently Van Anda arranged an S-100 (wildfire) course, and included members from Gillies Bay and Tla' amin. We are training with our wildfire equipment, and preplanning on how to access equipment if there is a major fire. All high risk industrial activites are now operating under new rules. They must have a fire plan and a way to fight fire. We are hoping the public will help too. First of all, be careful. Even a lawn mower can start a fire in the dry grass conditions we are dealing with. Sign up for the BC Wildfire Service mobile app. Not only is it an excellent source of information, it also has a reporting feature. The key to knocking down a fire is to get on it fast. So report any smoke. We will check it out and nobody will criticize you if it turns out to be a false alarm. If you don't want to use the app, make a note of Wildfire's numbers 1-800-633-5555 or on your cell *5555. You can also help if you have heavy equipment that we haven't already got on our list, or if you have a source of water we could access in an emergency.

If we all stay vigilant and work together we can keep our Island green.

Garden Club Notes

August is the time to start planning your cover crops before the busy harvest season starts! Here is some valuable information about cover crops and why they are important.

Many gardeners are aware of the use of cover crops, they are used to help prevent erosion and soil loss, improving soil condition and bulking. A few common examples are hairy vetch, winter wheat, fall rye and buckwheat. Some cover crops can be left as path cover between rows allowing better water retention in the summer heat, or dug under as a soil amendment, or fix nitrogen in the soil making it available for the next crop.

A less commonly used cover crop is the Daikon Radish also known as tillage radish. This versatile crop has a thick white tuber that can grow rapidly to over a foot in length, essentially drilling down, helping to break up hard packed soils and hardpan. It has been found that the natural heat, rapid growth and nutrient capture helps to build healthy soil organisms, and if left to decompose, the deep roots penetrate hard soil creating natural pores and pathways for air and water to travel. The length of the tuber can bring nutrients from depths, which are then stored for use by shallow rooted crops. The foliage is very fast growing and can be planted up to about 3 weeks before the first frost helping it outcompete weeds in winter, or allow protection to sparsely leaved summer crops such as beans and potatoes. Studies show that yields in corn and soybeans increase significantly following the use of tillage radish. The best part is the Daikon Radish can also be eaten as a spicy addition to most meals.

If you remove your summer/fall crops and leave your soil bare, the good soil microorganisms can starve and allow the undesirable ones to flourish making year round cover crops a great addition to your crop rotation.
