February is recognized as the month of love and acceptance. And with this in mind Joyce Wiebe, has written the following article.

#### A Garden of Friendship

As Valentine's Day approaches and we reflect on the joy of love and friendship in our lives, I wanted to wander my yard and reflect on the friendship I find there. My garden is a little bit of history, a little bit of newbie experimentation and many gifts given to me by many of you. I am still (five years later) finding gifts left to me from the previous owner. There are bluebells, and yellow loosestrife and a glorious coral coloured azalea; there are fruit trees and japonica, tulips and English Daisies, crocosmia and hardy fuchsias. At every season I see the touch of the previous owner's hard work, there for me to enjoy.

And then, there are the pieces you have brought me... roses from Kerstin, gladiolus and iris' from Diane, calendulas from Jocelyn, and asters from Morna. ### MUSEUM MUSINGS SOME TEXADA HISTORICAL FUN FACTS

DID YOU KNOW...

Texada has been given a few different names. The Tla'amin called it Sah-yeh-yeen. Spanish Captain Narvarz named it San Felix as the island was sighted on July 12, 1791 (Saint Felix's festival day).

In the early 1900's Emily (Turtle) Lake was a beehive of activity with Cornell mine operations, a railroad, two Chinese work camps and a rumoured "red light" district.

Our popular Sandcastle festivities had their origin in 1963 when the Chamber of Commerce proposed a community celebration (Texada Days) for the July 1st weekend.

In 1963 Rock Island Players' first production (*Kempy*) stopped abruptly when the power quit just before intermission. "The show must go on!" Audience members brought gas lanterns into the community hall to resume the performance.

Shelter Point Park was the site of a First Nations village over 3000 years ago. House depressions can be seen today. Bones, shells and other artifacts have been discovered in the middens. Today's "group site" was once a lagoon joined to the sea by a channel at the base of the hill, affording a protected harbour for canoes.

Texada's first newspaper, the *Coast Miner*, lasted one year (1900) until its editor, John Lawson, provoked community disquiet with an editorial criticizing social snobbery. The outraged party mentioned in the article stormed into Lawson's office, a fist fight ensued, the paper shut down and Lawson left the island (accompanied by his new wife, school teacher Emily Raper).

Texada's first car ferry *Atrevida* (1955-1969) was able to transport only 5 cars on a run. Residents would often park in the lineup overnight to secure a spot the next day.

Texada's first airstrip (1953) was roughed in at the south end near Anderson Bay to serve the loggers working in that area. In the early 1960's a site was chosen near Cranby Lake (above Gillies Bay) for a runway which has been improved over the years to become "Texada International".

The famed Van Anda "opera house" turned its back on dances and concerts to become the town hospital in 1900. In 1907 it was donated to the Columbia Coast Mission to serve patients from up and down the coast

The Hub is a Vancouver Coastal Health-approved community food preservation kitchen equipped with commercial equipment for flash-freezing, dehydrating, freeze-drying, baking, juicing, fermenting and canning all kinds of foods.

Anyone can join Texada Agriculture Group and use the Hub. Life membership in TAG costs a one-time fee of \$10 for individuals or \$15 for a household with two adults. For a nominal usage fee, Hub members can use the kitchen for stocking up a personal household food supply and for making commercial food products (but not for catering).



Thank you to everyone who gave a show of support at the qRD hearing for the exclusion of the Selkirk parcel of land from the ALR, that we are pursuing for seniors housing! Hopefully the ALC will hear us and we can get on to the next stage of the project.

We are planning a "Triple A Auction" this spring --- "Art, Activities and Accommodations". We are honoured to have original pieces from local artists as well as others donated from off island. ## GILLIES BAY FIRE DEPT. VAN ANDA FIRE DEPT.

#### What goes on at the Fire Hall?

Ever wonder what firefighters are doing when they aren't riding in parades or washing their trucks? A recent survey of Canadian Fire Departments provided some interesting information. The average Fire Department statistics for 2023 revealed that 10% of calls were for fire suppression (which includes wild fire and structural fires); 10% were for extreme weather (which on Texada is largely for downed power lines); 48% are medically related; and 30% are other hazards (like motor vehicle accidents). When we compared our annual statistics to these national numbers both Van Anda and Gillies Bay had similar numbers. The reason for providing this information is to demonstrate that we aren't just sitting around waiting for a house fire.

These statistics show the type of calls we respond to, but what they don't mention is the amount of training fire fighters do to be able to deal with all the incidents that we respond to. We need to have the training to respond effectively to a wide variety of situations. As volunteer departments we have to work around our members availability. Everyone has work and a personal life that we need to accommodate. We train weekly, most are evening practices, but we also do a Sunday practice once a month so we have time to do more involved scenarios.

We do this training, and are prepared to jump into a fire truck at any time of the day or night, regardless of the weather, to answer a call because we want to support our communities. If you also want to help protect your community, have you thought about joining your local fire department? Right now Van Anda needs more members, and they would welcome new recruits. Could you help? If you want more information please contact your local Fire Department.

# qathet REGIONAL DISTRICT

qathet Regional District receives \$96,000 grant to support Health and Wellness Initiative for Northside, Savary, Malaspina and Lasqueti Island Volunteer Fire Departments

qathet, BC – The qathet Regional District (qRD) is pleased to announce the receipt of a grant award of \$96,000 through the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) for the Volunteer and Composite Fire Departments Equipment and Training funding stream of the Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF). The intent of this funding stream is to build the resiliency of volunteer and composite fire departments.

The funds will be used for a health and wellness initiative designed to boost resiliency of our firefighters and first responders by supporting mental and physical health and wellness.

The project will kick off in Spring 2024 and will include mental health resiliency training, a holistic suite of mental and physical health and wellness training and workshops offered to our fire department members over the course of the year. These training initiatives and workshops aim to promote and bolster mental and physical health and wellness, fortify group dynamics, and enhance team cohesiveness and engagement.

The qRD has approximately 120 firefighters who respond to hundreds of emergency calls each year. These individuals are routinely exposed to traumatic events in the course of their duties. Recent research in this field shows that first responders are at a higher risk of mental health injuries. The qRD Occupational Health & Safety Program, in conjunction with the Fire Chiefs and Joint Occupational Health & Safety Committees from the Northside, Savary Island, Malaspina, and Lasqueti Island Volunteer Fire Departments have recognized the unique stresses on fire department members' mental health resulting from their service.

"In the last three years, the qRD has taken a number of steps to support our first responders' mental health. These initiatives include developing a Critical Incident Stress Management and Peer Support Program and related training, providing fire department members with a robust Member & Family Assistance Program, and providing proactive Occupational Stress Injury Check Ins with clinical case managers to assess our firefighter's health and wellness and prevent mental health injuries," said qathet Regional District Board Chair, Clay Brander.

## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Every year around this time I send out a warning that there will likely be an increase in this year's property taxes. As work on the qRD's 2024 budget evolves, there's no escaping the fact that this year **there will definitely be an increase in the property tax rate** throughout the region.

Several factors contribute to this. One is that property assessments are down overall which means a higher tax rate to equal the same amount of tax dollars to finance RD services. Another factor is the peak in debt financing charges this year for construction of the new Resource Recovery Centre (RRC), scheduled to be completed in 2024. There will be one-time start-up costs for training and equipment, plus costs for the actual operation of the facility once it opens. Because waste management is a regional service, all taxpayers in the qRD pay for it. Area D's share of these costs is about six per cent, based on our population.

I've not been a big fan of the RRC and related Waste Transfer Station because of the high cost, in addition to grant funding, at a time when many people are stretched thin financially. Nonetheless, the project has the support of a majority of Board members and we will hear a lot more about it as opening day comes closer.

Here on Texada, additional funds are planned for our Recreation Commission for structural analyses of both the Community Hall and the Old School. The hall has significant structural issues which need to be addressed related to long-term settling of the building, poor ventilation and deterioration of the crawl space. The Old School, which houses the Seniors Centre, Texada Library and Sandpipers Preschool, is in better shape but it is an older building sitting on an area subject to flooding and sea level rise.

The analyses will include costing of immediately-required repairs, as well as the cost of potential new construction. Additionally, the analyses will review major maintenance requirements of both buildings over the next 20 years. With this information, the Commission will be able to compare immediate and long-term costs of
