

## **Garden Club Notes**

Our next regular meeting will be on Wednesday, January 17th, 2pm at the Senior's Center in Gillies Bay. Chris Bernard will be leading a discussion on saving seeds. Please join us, all are welcome. This month Morna Rockingham, writes about the impressive Hollyhock.

Who hasn't been captivated by the romance of English gardens with tall spires of crepecrinkled flowers? Hollyhocks.

Alcea rosea, a genus in the mallow family Malvaceae, is native to China, although hollyhocks are most often associated with old English country gardens, grown close to cottages to promote abundance in the household: power, wealth and fertility.

Used medicinally in the Middle Ages and by herbalists to soothe sore throats, aid digestion. Also applied to rituals in pagan and Wiccan circles, requesting abundance due to the hollyhock's ability to reseed itself at the end of its cycle to ensure the next generation.

In the Victorian era, their six-to-eight-foot height was used to disguise a privy, ladies knew its location from the hollyhock patch! However, there is also a dwarf version of twenty inches. They prefer full sun, rich, moist, well-drained soil, grow best as a biennial flower, attracting butterflies and bees to its luxuriant pollen.

Rust, a fungal infection, is detriment to the plant's beauty and health, causing unsightly spots or lacy dying leaves - a problem in our garden. Rust spores over winter, reinfecting new plants every year. Although the calyces that hold the seeds may be the problem, not the seeds themselves, it is usually recommended that infected plants be removed from the garden and replaced by cultivars that are more rust resistant. Before buying, check the undersides of leaves and stems; buy seeds from uninfected plants; water only in the mornings at the base of the plant; prevent air stagnation by thinning the patch, removing the infected parts, cutting

stems at the base. Don't compost! Holly-hock's intriguing beauty of single or double-ruffled blossoms come in a variegated array of colours: pale yellow, apricot, shell pink, brick red, to a deep purple/scarlet, almost black shade. A beautiful plant to add to your garden.



On Saturday December 9th, Texada NatureKids travelled to MARS Wildlife Rescue Centre (marswildliferescue.com)! It was interstellar and we didn't need a rocket to get there! Despite turbulent weather and our late arrival, our guides welcomed us with full heart and stayed 2 hours (with flashlight in

hand) to host our tour after closing!

A dark morph red-tailed hawk ambassador bird and her human guide greeted us at the door to share her rescue story. Then, Texada NatureKids families split and continued with two tour guides. With parents included we had a total of 16 - eight adults and eight children.

Our guides led us through both the indoor nature centre, where Texada NatureKids families learned how to rescue an injured eagle from the wild. Starting with covering them with a blanket and picking them up correctly, assessing them in the animal hospital and hopefully if they are fully recovered, with time, and able to survive in the wild, they are released. Once outdoors, the rain pelted down, and our tour guide was alive with the passion for sharing rescued animal's important stories. Soaked Nature-Kids matched the enthusiasm with eager questions until the end! In the rescue enclosures, we visited a barred owl, a western screech owl, two eagles and two albino crows. We were gifted tips like avoiding using lead weights on fishing lines (which poison animals), continuing to cut the plastic rings open on can holders and avoiding throwing things like biodegradable food like apple cores out vehicle windows as they attract animals to roadsides increasing collisions. At the end, NatureKids had time to explore the indoor centre further, which is full of neat nature treasures and engaging mysteries and scavenger hunts.

Texada NatureKids were each gifted a t-shirt from MARS and a surprise bag as souvenirs - thank you to the Texada Island Recreation Commission (TIRC) who made this trip possible by funding us with \$1000. A deeply valued learning experience and a must see if you are travelling to Comox!

#### **Community CPR Training**

We hope you all had a happy and safe holiday season. As you are making New Year's resolutions, we have a suggestion for you. Learn a valuable skill that will help you to help others.

Van Anda and Gillies Bay Fire Departments both have first responder programs to provide medical assistance until more advanced medical care is available. This can include providing CPR. However, we are all volunteers, and it can take some time for members to assemble and get to the scene. When dealing with cardiac issues time is critical. CPR should be started immediately. After just **four minutes**, brain damage begins to occur. After **ten minutes**, it is unlikely they can be saved. Would you know what to do?

We would like to help you. Captain Ann Snow, Medical Trainer for the Northside Fire Department has agreed to come to Texada to put on a community CPR course. This will be as low stress as possible. No fee, no test, and consequently no certificate. But you will know how to administer CPR and use an AED after calling 911 to get help. Training is scheduled for Saturday, January 27 from 1:00 to 5:00 at the Gillies Bay Fire Hall.

If you are interested in participating please contact the Gillies Bay Volunteer Fire Department (604-414-5121 or Chief@gilliesbayvfd.ca) to register. That will help us to know how much equipment we need to set up.

#### **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS**

The Van Anda Volunteer Firefighters Association will be having their final AGM on January 13, 2024, at the Legion in Van Anda, beginning at 10:00 am. The Van Anda Volunteer Firefighters Association is stepping aside and dissolving. This will clear a path forward for both Gillies Bay and the Van Anda Firefighters to join under one umbrella to be called the "TEXADA Firefighters Association". The differences in criteria for Society members meant that the associations could not be merged. I am currently the President of the Van Anda Firefighters Association. Our Society will cease to exist once the dissolution is complete and then the new "Texada Firefighters Association" can be formed. Thanks to all of the Community for your support and participation in many fundraising events. Thank you to the members and volunteers for the success that was achieved. ## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Happy New Year, Texada! Kudos to all of you who volunteer in some capacity to support our community. Kudos, too, to those who aren't ye volunteers but will step forward during the year ahead. It's we the people who make a community strong and on that score our island is truly blessed.

Last fall, the qRD conducted a region-wide survey regarding the future of the concession at Shelter Point Park. It was done region-wide as the regional park's expenses are financed by taxpayers from throughout the region. Applause to everyone who sent in a response. These made a huge difference. The results have been tabulated and a whopping 91 per cent of respondents supported keeping the concession open.

In all, 662 responses were received, of which 67 per cent were from Texada residents and property owners. Clearly we are very passionate about the concession.

Some other survey responses:

89 per cent said the concession was part of the camping experience at Shelter Point Among park users, 69 per cent of campers use the concession, while 80 per cent of day users do likewise

56 per cent said the concession should be open for a longer season Regarding finances:

76 per cent said a subsidy is necessary for the concession

62 per cent supported additional taxation to subsidize the concession

77 per cent opposed the qRD receiving proceeds from concession sales, though

63 per cent supported the concession operator paying the qRD a fee towards maintenance costs

The Board's Committee of the Whole agreed to ask staff for a report about potential **options that enable the concession to remain open**. This will be voted on by the qRD Board in January.

Meanwhile, the application by **Texada Island Non-profit Seniors Housing Society** and **Selkirk Mountain Forest to exclude land from the Agricultural Land Reserve** goes to a public hearing this month. Input from this hearing will form part of the application to the Agricultural Land Commission to use the 3.24 hectare site across GB Road from the hall for seniors housing.

Please have your say about this important project. Attend in person **Tuesday**, **Jan. 16**, **5pm at the hall.** Written submissions may be sent to planning@qathet.ca and must be received by the end of the public hearing.

I recently reread "*The Guernsey Literary & Potato Peel Pie Society*" by Mary Ann Shaffer and Annie Barrows, c2008. The author, Mary Ann Shaffer died before the novel was finished. Her niece, children's author, Annie Barrows completed her aunt's novel.



The story begins in January 1946. The book is based on historical fact, although the characters are fiction. The mass evacuation of Island children 24 hours before the occupying forces arrived and the conditions under which the Islanders lived during the occupation are factual.

The novel is in letter format. The Reader's Guide in the back of the book asks the question: What was it like to read a novel composed entirely of a letter? What would you answer? The primary character, Juliet Ashton, a writer receives a letter from an Islander who has an old book with her name & address written on the inside front cover. Juliet becomes curious about Guernsey during the WW11 occupation and the creation of the The Guernsey Literary & Potato Peel Pie Society. Thus follows a flood of letters from Society members, each telling their own experiences and stories. Juliet has an assignment is to write a 3 part series of articles for the TIMES on the occupation of Guernsey.

Friendship develops between Juliet and Society members. The Society was formed as a ruse to explain why residents were out after curfew. This book is a novel of joy, sadness, humour and strength. It is worth adding to your 2024 reading list or watch the 2018 Netflix movie.
