#### GILLIES BAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

SUMMER WATER RESTRICTIONS: year, unlike the dry spring last year, gardens, pastures, and the forest are lush, damp, and green at the end of June. We are blessed with adequate water from Cranby lake; nevertheless we need to take care. We use more than three times our winter water use during the hot dry summer. This means more expense to supply the infrastructure; also to keep supply and water pressure adequate for fire protection. Summer water restrictions have one basic principle: Don't waste water! This year, effective July first we enter stage one of our water restriction.

Watering lawns and gardens is allowed from 5 AM to 9 AM and from 5 PM to 9 PM. Even numbered houses may water on even numbered days and odd numbered houses may water on odd numbered days. Thank you for being responsible users.

BULK WATER: To meet requests and potential need for residents of the Gillies Bay Improvement District we will supply bulk raw water (NOT potable water) as a pilot project this year. To apply for bulk water please phone 604 223 7757. Water can be supplied, by appointment, in your container, for a basic fee of \$30.00 for up to 2 cubic meters of water (approximately 500 gallons).

WATER ADVISORY: We are permanently on a water advisory for immune compromised persons. Also, we are on a boil water advisory due to higher than acceptable turbidity, despite repeated aggressive pipe flushing. We can expect, as in past years, to be on boil water advisories as the hot weather progresses. This situation will not change until an effective filtration and treatment system is in place. Presently, we are conducting a pilot project with an ambition to put that system in place.

Hello Texada! Here are some notes on recent events: WATER RESTRICTIONS: Stage 3 will be in effect starting Saturday June 29. This is necessary to avoid maxing out the treatment plant capacity, which can happen at the beginning of summer. Stage 3 restrictions include the following:

NO LAWN WATERING

No washing vehicles, RVs, or boats.

No filling or adding water to swimming pools, hot tubs, garden ponds, or decorative fountains.

No washing any outdoor surfaces, including sidewalks, walkways, driveways, patios, decks, or windows.

Hand watering and using sprinklers to water trees, shrubs, flowers, and vegetables is limited to one hour daily per coverage area and allowed only in the evening or early morning.

Use of micro-irrigation or drip irrigation systems to water trees, shrubs, flowers, and vegetables is allowed on any day, at any time, as required.

WATER QUALITY & PLANT UPGRADES: The Water Quality Advisory is still in place due to temporary Ultraviolet Treatment (UVT) insufficiency. UVT is the final step in water treatment before chlorination. The UVT system is not adequate at present due to the dissolved solids not being removed by the Ion Exchangers (Ionex), as designed. Replacement of the Ionex media will solve this issue however it is a complicated and expensive process. Plans are in place to replace the media and clean the fouled Ionex tanks as well as adding a sand filtration unit between the self-cleaning filters and the cartridge filters. This sand filter was donated to VAID from a Vancouver Island location that has since connected to a larger water supply system. It will save us money on treatment consumables such as cartridges and salt, and extend the life of the new ionex media.

Vancouver Coastal Health continues to report no issues from the monthly water testing.







## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

First, a round of applause for our Texada-based road crews who do an excellent job of keeping our roads safe. My concerns about insufficient funding for road maintenance are no reflection on the quality of work that is done here. Our crews do the best job possible, given the limited resources available through the province. Thanks and appreciation go out to our local road crews.

There are a couple of issues which have recently come to the qRD which I'd like your opinion about.

The first is our Thursday community bus. We've been waiting since 2019 for the necessary approvals from Victoria to expand the service to a second day per week. BC Transit supports the expansion. So does the qRD. The province, however, has said no yet again, because it's priority in 2024 is electrification of fleets. Resources are limited and BC Transit says it will apply for the expansion again next year.

In the meantime, I'd like to know how many possible-riders are turned away now due to insufficient space. How big a problem is this and do we need to make a stronger case to Victoria for our second day of service? I've asked BC Transit to track the request calls that come in, which they haven't yet agreed to do. If you've been affected by this issue, please send me a note at the contact info below.

The other issue for your consideration is dangerous dogs. Recently, two unrelated complaints were received by the qRD from two Texada residents who were viciously attacked by dogs roaming free. Both incidents required medical intervention. At a recent meeting, the RCMP told the qRD that having a bylaw in place regarding dangerous dogs would give officers increased authority for enforcement. As a result, staff were asked for a report about what animal control options are available. How do you feel about this? Would such a bylaw be welcome here? Again, please use the contact info below.

The RCMP asked for the qRD Board's priorities for policing during the next year and three were put forward:

- Dog control education and enforcement
- Texada Island detachment sustainability
- Savary Island reconnaissance and presence

Finally, great effort went into keeping the park concession open. We all need to get out and support the concession if we value it as part of our community. The use it or lose it theory totally applies. Plus, the food is delicious!

Thank you to those members who attended the Annual General Meeting on a sunny Sunday afternoon. The following Directors who let their names stand for re-election were elected by acclamation: Leslie Goresky, Dean Macdonald, Derek Wills and Pam Kenny. Cathy Brown welcomed Juanita Walton, the new recording secretary who took the minutes and Terry Hollo who served as Electoral Officer.

## Texada-The Great Upheaval

Once upon a time the Northern Hemisphere was covered with extensive and repetitive glaciers and ice sheets more then 14,000 years ago. A two fold cataclysmic event occurred causing an abrupt change in Earth's climate. The first is known as the, Younger-Dryas hypothesis. It is believed that a large comet or meteor struck North America causing a reversal in a warming trend which delivered North America and Europe into an Ice Age lasting another 1500 years. A second event, both European and Greenland maritime ice cores propose, produced an extremely rapid warming and melting of the immense ice sheets ending the Pleistocene Epoch, due to an extinction level event occurring, and beginning the Holocene period 11,800 years ago.

Imagine kilometers thick glacial ice rapidly melting, it has been suggested, within a 40 - 50 year period causing tremendous amounts of fresh water to enter the North Atlantic and European seas. Does the mythical Noah's Ark and the great flood come to mind. Here in the Pacific Northwest, namely the Georgia Basin, great subterranean faults opened to release stored hydrothermal material from pressurized magma chambers below wanting to replace the void and vacuum left by the rapid retreat of weighted glacial ice. This earth rebounding effect brought with it massive chunks of the ocean floor, the ancient limestone beds that are now part of Texada Island. Further upheaval brought the more recent porphyries and basalt which make up most of Texada's geology.

The ascending fluids and material pushing Texada up from beneath the sea happened in pulses separated by intervals lasting thousands of years. One can note the old beaches as you drive up the many levels of Shelter Point Road. Repetitive magmatic pulses introduced a variety of material, minerals and metals into the surrounding limestone beds and fractured volcanic rocks. First the lighter material, quartz, dikes and sills filled the fissures and fractures... then the heavier material, zinc, iron, copper and gold. A rock hound and prospectors bonanza. Thus, we have our Island today, rich in geological history but only a newcomer on the visual scene. Some say the ancient transient peoples of this area saw the Island rise from the sea... and, as suggested, this could possibly be true. Food for thought... this geological transition is still taking place... it's called, "Climate Change".

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Firefighters BBQ Fundraiser

Every one loves a party, but what the heck are the Texada Fire fighters fund raising for. What is an initial attack wildfire vehicle, and why do the Fire Fighters think they need one when they already have those big trucks? First question is why do they need wildfire equipment when BC Wildfire are responsible for dealing with wild fires? We have a good relationship with the BC Wildfire crew, and are always happy to transfer command when they arrive on site. But even if the Wildfire crew are available (which isn't always the case if there are multiple fires), they are based in Powell River, and it takes time for them to get to Texada with their equipment. Usually, the Texada Fire Departments get a request to supply personnel and equipment until Forestry can arrive. With any fire timing is critical, and with a wild fire a minor problem can quickly become a big one if it isn't stopped. The multiple demands on BC Wildfire as summers get hotter, lead to qathet Regional District deciding to purchase its own brush truck (similar to Wildfire's trucks). But for Texada we have the same problem with access to the qathet truck. They still have to get it to the Island, which takes valuable time.

So if we are going to have to deal with a wild fire for ourselves for a while, why not use those fancy big trucks? We do now, but like any job you want to have the right tools to do it right. So far this year we have only responded to two fires. Both of them wildfires. The Crescent Bay fire was on old logging road and getting our mainline pumpers in there would potentially have caused serious damage. The last wildfire we were at, the Gillies Bay Tanker had a tire damaged and needed to be replaced for \$1600. The beach fire at the Sand Banks we couldn't even access with our trucks...it was time to haul out the fire buckets and hike in.

So what is the right tool for getting to an off road fire? We are looking at an ATV or 4x4 truck that could have a skid mounted on it that would be useful for either fire or medical evacuation on trails that are too narrow, or rough, for a fire truck. We've identified the type of equipment that we need, and have costed it out. Since it would be useful anywhere on Texada, and not just in one Improvement District this was something the Fire fighters Association decided to take on as a project, and is currently fund raising to purchase. ## **Garden Club Notes**

No meetings for the next few months. The Garden Club meetings will be starting up again in October. We will be in our gardens for the summer practising what we learned at the meetings! Looking forward to getting together then. Happy Gardening.

Growing tomatoes from your own harvested seeds connects us to our farming past. Lori John stitched together an article by Ron Finley, a handout from Seeds of Diversity and her neighbour's insights for saving seeds to put this article together.

Easy, fun and free - here are two ways to save Tomato Seeds.

#### Option one

- 1. Choose your tomato. Start with a fresh, ripe, juicy tomato.
- 2. Slice the tomato in half. Using a spoon, scoop the middle pulp/gel that encases the seeds.
- 3. Sort the tomato seeds by placing them in a strainer. With slow running water, massage, rinsing the pulp away, separating the seeds.
- 4. After straining excess water, remove seeds from strainer onto a tea towel. Separate the seeds and lightly pat them with a paper towel, getting rid of as much water and gel as you can. The gel can attract fruit flies.
- 5. Let the seeds sit out for a week or two indoors away from direct sunlight to thoroughly dry.
- 6. Store the tomato seeds using paper envelopes labelling the variety name and year. Keep the envelopes over winter in a cool dry place to plant next spring.

#### Option 2 Ferment tomato seeds

This option helps the seeds produce a greater quantity and quality of fruit.

Steps 1 and 2 are the same as above.

- 3. Put the seeds and pulp/gel in a clean sterilized airtight container (Mason Jar). No need to add water if the lid fits well. Keep the container in a warm place for three days out of the sun.
- 4. After 3 to 5 days the gel ferments releasing the viable seeds which sink to the bottom.
- 5. Add water. Let the seeds sink to the bottom again, then carefully pour off the rotted pulp/gel and any floating seeds. Repeat.
- 6. Pour the seeds into a strainer to drain the remaining water.
- 7. Follow Step 4 through Step 6 in option one.

<u>Note</u>: The seeds of hybrid tomato varieties will not grow when re-planted in a future season.
