

In May and June we are focused on aggressive flushing of the various pipelines and, this year, a thorough cleaning and disinfecting of the reservoir on airport road. Thank you to the volunteer fire department for your help, above and beyond your mission. Also, our pilot project for the proposed slow sand filtration process is running smoothly to provide data so that we can present a complete plan to residents and water users for cleaner, filtered water. A special thank you to trustee Keith Franklin for all vour work on this necessary project. Also, thank you to Doug Nikirk for your volunteer work in completing a work-safe necessary storage shed (at minimal cost) for the chlorine related chemicals we use to make our water safer. As well, thank you to Lafarge for donating used steel sheeting for the walls and roof of this shed. Strong volunteer and community spirit is alive and well on Texada.

We are working on a capital replacement plan on the entire waterworks, over a long term. This should catch most potential leaks before they happen.

Our aim, to extend the waterworks along Gillies Bay Road (If approved by residents) is continuing with financial analysis and possible coordination with other governmental agencies. The financial analysis for a water filtration plan still requires work. Roger Kimmerly;

WATER QUALITY: The Water Quality Advisory in still in place while we continue address the issues caused by some components reaching the end of their serviceable life. Vancouver Coastal Health continues to report no issues from the monthly water testing.





# **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Please join me for the next informal RD Discussion Night Thursday, June 6, 7 pm at the Legion. I'll provide updates regarding qRD initiatives that affect Texada. Bring your comments, questions and ideas. What's on your mind?

We all know the quality of maintenance the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI) does on our roads. It was no surprise to learn, via a long-awaited **Texada Drainage Study**, that MOTI infrastructure under the roads is not maintained any better. The study was first requested in 2018, following a similar study on the mainland, MOTI committed to partnering with qRD to finance the work, but didn't contribute its part of the funding until 2023. The study's purpose was to assess the condition and vulnerability of culverts crossing Texada's major roadways.

What the study revealed is that culverts which are meant to mitigate and reduce future flooding risks are instead contributing to the problem. Under our roads is a mish-mash of badly-corroded culverts, many of which are poorly maintained with accumulated debris and vegetation. Other culverts are undersized or submerged, with many identified as being poorly constructed to begin with. Some need replacing, others need a larger carrying capacity. Still others need digging out and many need cleaning out.

**So what do the local MOTI managers say about the situation?** While they recognize the deficiencies, they say limitations on both staff and financial resources prevent additional maintenance work from being done. At a recent meeting with local MOTI reps, they encouraged elected officials to lobby the province to increase their funding. As a result, I've introduced motions at the qRD calling on UBCM to ask Victoria for additional maintenance resources and also requesting a meeting with MOTI minister Rob Fleming at UBCM's September conference to ask in person.

It just makes sense to build the maintenance/repair of culverts into the annual MOTI work plan, doing a certain percentage each year. The cost of doing this work isn't cheap, except when compared with the potential cost of not doing it.

On Texada, six priority areas were identified where culvert failure is significant:

- -VA Creek at VA Avenue
- -Marble Road/VA
- -Priest Lake at GB Road
- -Airport Road
- -Cranby Creek at GB Road, and
- -Staaf Creek at Bell Road

As residents we can all keep a lookout at these areas and report concerns to MOTI contractor;

# Underground

The arctic blizzards had started and the lake was freezing over... it was October '84 and time to head south and home. Our time at Rusty Mountain camp in the Yukon had ended. Our camp manager wanted us to tour the famous Husky Mine at Keno Hill. He knew the mine manager there and had arranged a tour for the four of us to collect a few samples and perhaps a rare specimen or two before heading south.

We arrived at the Husky mine and after introductions, a safety speech and a mine geology tutorial we were then taken to the change room. We donned slickers, boots, hard hat and lamps and descended down in the shaft's iron cage, what took like forever, to the lowest level of the mine's newly timbered drift.

The mine geologist had told us to try our luck at the face. A mad dash with hammers and picks swinging and singing... the face was assaulted. All but me had attacked the newly exposed ore. I had drilled underground in the past and had known the best way to find anything worth picking was to ask the drillers and muckers who worked there. So I sauntered over to have a conversation with one of them. Together we joked about the assault at the face, when then, he reached up into the timbers and pulled out a handful of rocks. I couldn't believe what I saw, rare crystal specimens of ruby silver, polybasite, pyrargyrite and native silver wire. "Keep them" he said, "I've got lots."

We arrived back to the change room all eager to show who had collected the best samples amongst us. All eyes and mouth's aghast when my turn arrived. "Where did you get those?" They cried in unison. "Well... while you guys were swinging hammers and picks with gusto I was behind you picking up what was flying over your heads."

To this day I still have them in my collection. As it turns out, that driller hand picked specimens to send to collectors and museums. I guess it was his way to make up for the hard work they had to endure underground in the muck and mire. Most often It's not the CEOs, Supers or managers but the grunts and doers that know really how things work, as in life itself.

# **News From the Library**

Greetings Everyone.

#### History of the Texada Island Library (cont.):

Originally there were 3 libraries on Texada Island. Blubber Bay Library consisted of a cupboard that was donated by Burg & Johnson (Hardware Store in Westview) in 1962. This cupboard was kept in the Blubber Bay Community Hall. The Van Anda Library was a cupboard on wheels that opened up. It was kept at Mary's Café. It is believed that both libraries had closed prior to 1974.

The Gillies Bay Library was established prior to 1960. A letter written to the Regional Board in 1979 states that it had been running for 25 years. The "Open Shelf Library" provided books from Victoria. Books were mailed out to individuals with paid return postage. At one time there was the "Travelling Library" again out of Victoria. The books were kept in private homes. Later the library was given space, another cupboard in the Commissary, which was named the "Dog House Café". It was located near the site of the present RCMP Station. After that a bunkhouse was donated for the library's use.

In a letter dated May 2, 1975 the Powell River District Libraries assured the volunteer group that they would give "any support and assistance possible". At this time a "block loan" was offered as the "The Open Shelf Library" and the "Travelling Library" books were no longer available.

#### Sounds of Summer

Did you hear all the sirens on May 12<sup>th</sup>? Unfortunately, with our drier summers, these are going to be a more common sound. The fire rating was only at Moderate and we had to respond to a small wildland fire in the bush off Crescent Bay Road. At this time of year, such fires are almost all human caused. While your local fire departments will attempt to respond as quickly as possible, we have limitations.

We need the whole community to help. Think about how your actions can result in a fire. Know who to contact if you see a fire (the answer to that is 911 and they will take it from there). Think about how you can help. We are always looking to recruit more volunteers. The Van Anda Fire Department needs members now. We will provide the training and equipment if you are interested in joining. All we are looking for is individuals who want to do something to help their community.

If you don't want to join your local fire department, at least you can help by not getting in the way. Bush fires especially have restricted access, and spectators can cause real problems. We understand that you want to know what is happening, but blocking access for equipment or work can be a real issue. You can also help if you have a pond or swimming pool that can be accessed for water. Once we arrive on scene we can go through a lot of water very quickly, which is why we haul additional water to the scene in our tender. If you know where we can get water closer to a fire it would help to reduce the turnaround time. Contact your local department to let us know if we can access water at your property.

We would also encourage Crescent Bay Road residents to think about signing the existing petition to expand the Van Anda Fire District. Petitions are available through the Van Anda Improvement District Office. You can get your questions answered there, and get the necessary paperwork.

**Garden Club Notes** 

No meetings for the next few months. The Garden Club meetings will be starting up again in October. We will be in our gardens for the summer practising what we learned at the meetings! Looking forward to getting together then. Happy Gardening.

Here is a timely article from Jan Slakov (janslakov@proton.me) about water usage.

Finding ways to minimize water consumption makes sense, especially when we know that we're sharing our lakes' with other life forms. So, let's water early so as much water as possible can be absorbed into the soil. We mulch our plants and where possible, we use drip irrigation.

It helps to choose plants that don't need much water during the summer, such as; most spring-flowering bulbs, oregano, rosemary & other herbs, lavender, yarrow, goldenrod, asters, lunaria, garlic. Native shrubs such as Oregon grape, red-flowering currants and many trees, once established, need very little water. It's best to avoid resinous trees like cedar near structures, as they pose a wildfire risk.

Landscapers cloth can help suppress weeds and retain soil moisture. Deep root watering spikes that screw onto pop bottles can provide a relatively simple drip irrigation system.

And why not save as much "grey" water (eg. from hand, dish, clothes washing) as we can? That leads naturally to feeling uneasy about flushing drinking water down the toilet; urine has nutrients plants need, so finding ways to keep it in the nutrient cycle makes sense.

Pollinators are among a gardener's (& food-lover's!) best friends, so look to host a wide variety of flowering plants, especially native plants for native insects. (Although dandelions are delicious, their pollen is protein poor, compared to other plants, such as willows.) And beautiful bats! Lactating mothers especially need water in open pools they can safely skim over. For bees, shallow pools of water (eg. in a plate) will help them survive heat waves & drought.

We too, are part of nature. Let's keep learning how to work in respect for and of her ways.
