Garden Club Notes

Please join us for our next Garden Club meeting to be held at the Community Hall on Wednesday, March 15th at 2 pm. All are welcome, bring your questions and concerns about your garden and we will try to help.

This month Lynn Cole, our most seasoned gardener at 92 years wise graces us with her experiences of what has worked.

Looking back and forward. In the earlier gardens, when we grew an abundance of vegetables and fruits, the Stokes catalog was our main seed source. The early corn was "Seneca 60," smaller ears but so sweet. Ballhead green cabbage yielded super large, firm heads, wonderful for making cabbage rolls, our family favorite, a sweet and sour concoction. Recipe to follow. Our strawberry plants, ever-bearing, the Sovereign variety gave us plenty of fresh berries with lots for freezing and jam making. My raspberries are Old Type Latham, which I still grow from roots transplanted from one garden to another. My current garden of 15 years is in the process of being downsized. Winter 2021, Mother Nature took a hand and eliminated some specimens. Lost were a sprawling Ceanothus sometimes called California Lilac, a citrus scented golden Cyprus and also the main parts of a large group of Draco, Dragon tree. I'm glad to see there is still life at the base. Unfortunately I also lost my Red Haven peach tree. The lack of rain last summer took its toll: It's survival of the hardiest. Spring will show the outcome.

Sweet and Sour Stuffed Cabbage Rolls

- -1/3 cup raw rice cooked in 1 cup milk in a double boiler, let cool.
- -mix 3/4 lb ground beef and 1/8 lb ground pork, combined with 1 beaten egg, salt and pepper

to taste, and 1 cup milk. Add cooled cooked rice.

-1 head 3 lb cabbage cored. Immerse in boiling water till leaves are pliable

Carefully remove leaves. On one leaf heap mix of rice and meat, roll up envelope fashion. Fasten flap with toothpick. Continue until mixture and leaves are used up.

Brown rolls on both sides using 2 TBSP of butter in a heavy skillet, in batches. Lay browned rolls in large cooking pot if on stove



top or baking dish if using oven. Sprinkle with 2 TBSP brown sugar, pour 1 cup boiling water in which 1 bouillon cube has been dissolved. Cover and simmer 1 1/2 hours gently basting and turning occasionally. Remove cabbage rolls and thicken liquid with 1 TBSP flour blended to a smooth paste with a little cold water. Stir in 2 tsp vinegar and serve gravy with the cabbage rolls. Adjust to your tastes and enjoy our family favorite.

FERRY ADVISORY COUNCIL REPORT

BC Ferries Meeting & Drop-in - Feb 21, 2023

It was nice to see a small group of Texadans did make the trip to Powell River to be at the meeting in-person, as well as an individual who took advantage of the Zoom option. With so many residents who constantly complain about BC Ferries and their policies, I was surprised to see the lack of participation. As a concerned resident you need to standup and object in-person, not complain online. BC Ferries wants you to complain online because then it is not a complaint, it's just chatter.

All who attended the meeting and the Drop-in received a free ferry pass home, NO COST TO YOU! So, this is my summary of issues discussed and spoken about:

After our disastrous meeting with BC Ferries last year your Texada FAC Reps are still on-point. There was a suggestion by BC Ferries that the reason we didn't get the Direct Route (Texada - Comox, Comox - Texada) was an increased cost to BC Ferries of \$250,000. We asked about the financial breakdown and BC Ferries would not give it to us. We were advised that an FOI (Freedom of Information) request was required. SUBMISSION: FOI has been submitted. Once that information is collected, then we expect to fill out an SSR.

In an effort to gather some travel analysis of the Comox-Texada run, it was suggested by Doug Nikirk that since BC Ferries is discounting (\$39.00 for Vehicle + Driver) the last Salish run daily from Comox, BC Ferries could increase their revenue by picking up Texada passengers and dropping them off at Blubber Bay, on that last run. This would also give BC Ferries an idea of potential travel.

ISSUE: No answer yet. There was no one of authority who could make the call.

It has been an on-going suggestion to move the BC Ferries electronic sign from Blubber Bay to the area near the gas station so to inform residents that the ferry is cancelled and direct them to the Van Anda Government Dock for the water taxi.

ISSUE: Sign needs to be on BC Ferries property. If it is moved to a new location, then an agreement needs to be with MOT (Ministry of Transport).

It has been an on-going suggestion to widen the Blubber Bay Road from BC Cement Road to the existing double lane, so that on days of large volume, the school bus and ferry walk on customers do not need to travel over the double solid line to get past the ferry line-up parked on the side of the road. To do so is against the Law and is a huge safety issue.

ISSUE: An agreement needs to be with Blubber Bay Quarry and MOT (Ministry of Transport) to widen the road.

It has been an on-going suggestion to BC Ferries that to help the Loading officer get the most vehicles on the ferry, that a camera or system be set-up on Blubber Bay Road so he can see all the traffic.

RESOLUTION: BC Ferries stated that a camera system is being installed. Date TBD.

It has been an on-going suggestion that the 1 pm (Texada) - 1:50 pm (Powell River) Ferry schedule needs be of a longer duration or implemented as a Daily scheduled run all year long.

ISSUE: Employee overtime costs are the main issue. This sailing currently only runs from June 28 – Sept 5.

SUBMISSION: A BC Ferries SSR is currently being filled out to have the run added to the schedule as part of our regular service all year long.

The last item is called "Performance Term 6". This is the proposed fares, ships, dock improvement, etc. BC Ferries wants to do from 2024 – 2028.

Unfortunately, BC Ferries never included any Texada items, so I ask you to write to the Commissioner by September, 2023. These documents are now posted on the Commissioner's website beferrycommission.ca for public feedback.

Gillies Bay water... what's the problem? the members that get things done. What's the fix?

The problem is that the water is surface water with lots of stuff in it that makes it hard to meet the current drinking water standards. The bacteria can be killed with chlorination, but not all viruses and cysts and parasites. In addition the chlorine reacts with organic compounds, mainly from decaying vegetation, to produce trihalomethanes (THMs) which are suspected carcinogens. One big advantage of using chlorine is that it stays in the water and continues to kill bacteria inside pipes all the way to where the water is used.

If GBID is to meet the current drinking water standards there will be significant costs involved. The intention is to use our existing chlorinator, but a new building to house the treatment equipment and a new storage tank will be required, as well as a larger main line from the storage tank into Gillies Bay. GBID has an application for "Gas Tax Grant" funding similar to the program that funded Van Anda's treatment plant. The announcement on that funding is due any day now. In the meantime the Board is looking for other funding opportunities and trying to get all the ducks lined up for the next steps.

GBID annual general meeting is May 7th. If you or someone you know might be interested in helping out or standing for one of the two volunteer board positions please come forward. The water system and Fire Department belong to the GBID tax payers. Think of it as a Co-Op, and like most Co-Ops it is

MUSEUM MUSINGS FOUR PROSPECTORS

After 1909 when world copper

prices fell, mines in Van Anda closed. Some unemployed men continued to prospect around Texada but four adventurous friends decided to seek their fortunes elsewhere.

In the summer of 1903 William Stromberg, James Raper, George McLeod and Billy Law planned an ambitious expedition to investigate old copper workings on the Queen Charlotte Islands (Haida Gwaii).

Keeping in mind that small rowboats were the "family car" of the time, the four thought nothing of embarking on their 1000 km odyssey in their 16-foot, clinker-built rowboat powered only by oars and sails.

Favourable winds sped their passage northward from Texada but fighting the headwinds in Johnstone Strait proved exhausting and progress was slow. Stormy seas sometimes forced them to remain ashore for days, nights spent in sleeping bags on the beach. Their stash of dried fruit, flour, yeast and some canned food was eagerly devoured.

After regrouping at Alert Bay the men headed north to attempt Queen Charlotte Sound. Luckily Captain Warner of the coastal freighter *Bosquitz* recognized their need and offered to tow them across the dangerous open waters.

When a storm broke half way across, the men went "below" into the ship's hold, presently occupied by a tethered, bellowing, malcontented bull! As the seas grew stronger the bull broke loose and all five "steerage passengers" were tossed wildly back and forth. The roar of the bull and shouts of the men alerted the crew who arrived to help restore order.

After camping at Bonita Island, a steady breeze welcomed them into Hecate Strait. Unfortunately the wind soon dropped, forcing the four to take turns rowing all day and night. A sudden storm broke, tossing and battering their little boat. Thoroughly exhausted, their boat damaged and their provisions wrecked, the four Texadans made it to Queen Charlotte's south shore.

They were rescued by the Haida who, despite their fearsome reputation, welcomed them, repaired the rowboat and took them to Skidegate where they were treated to a feast and offered lodging.

The Haida Gwaii prospects must have shown promise as the prospectors returned over the next several summers to work the claims.



Thank you to everyone who submitted survey responses and attended the community meeting re bike paths, aka Active Transportation Corridors (ATCs). They are meant to be for all forms of active transportation, including walking, running and mobility devices, as well as bikes.

A total of 91 Texadans returned the surveys: 65 said yes to paths, 23 said no and there were three maybes. This equals **72 per cent in favor**. Of the "no" responses, the main reason for opposition was wanting the money spent instead on fixing roads or upgrading local water systems. While I sympathize with these sentiments, any funding the RD receives for ATCs can only be spent for this purpose and nothing else. Only MOTI has the authority to maintain roads. In terms of location, GB to the park received the most first choices, while VA to GB was a close second.

Some great feedback came from the 44 attendees at the community meeting. Sitting in a circle, everyone was heard. Technical considerations raised included safety, path surface, narrow roads and shoulders, ditches and piggy-backing on the GBID's water line extension.

A detached path was preferred but there was general consensus to go with whatever's possible. Ideally grant funding would cover the costs, with a phased approach. Labor and materials could be donated. Another great suggestion was for a local committee to provide input into the project.

So what happens next? Based on your feedback, there is a mandate for me to take this issue to the RD. My first step will be meeting with staff to determine the best process for moving this forward. Will provide updates in future columns.

Meanwhile, one issue which affects us significantly is the lack of **housing** here on Texada. People are finding it difficult to find a place and some potential residents give up and leave. The region's Housing Needs Report (2021) states that in area D we'll need 46 more housing units by 2026, the highest of the four electoral areas covered by the report. It recommends that half of these units be for ownership and half for purpose-built rentals (11 units affordable). In thinking about how to make this happen, I introduced the following motion which passed unanimously:

That staff report back regarding solutions to mitigate the current shortage of housing in rural areas, and that the review consider best practices of other RDs, which types of housing have been most successful, over-arching legislation regarding affordable housing and VCH regulations which may restrict multiple housing units from being developed on single lots.

Let's hope some solutions can be found; the sooner the better.




