THANK-YOU PETE STILES!

The Texada Island Heritage Society will miss our knowledge-keeper, inspiration, story -teller and friend - Pete Stiles - as he moves to the mainland after 58 years on Texada.

Pete was born in Trail, BC in 1929, his father the Chief Engineer for Cominco. Pete's first summer job was digging ditches for the company but he was fired for leaving early. His supervisor was cautioned, "You can't fire him. His dad is the boss." He was rehired but greater things awaited.

After high school Pete attended Royal Roads College, then achieved a BSc in Mining Engineering at UBC in 1951.

In 1958 Pete married Monica Brown whom he knew in Trail when they were in school together at age 8. Their partnership lasted 59 years.

Pete worked 5 years at Britannia Mines then in Calgary, Port McNeill and Zeballos where he ran the mine which shipped iron ore to Japan.

In 1966 Stan Beale, Sr. offered Pete a job on Texada at his Beale Quarries (later sold to Ideal Cement) and Pete became Quarry Engineer for the company and, later, manager.

Pete says that he appreciated the "good working conditions" and had a "fun time" there. Everyone knew everyone, with 3 generations of Texadans employed. "I really enjoyed it."

Pete's life on Texada was not all about work. His cheerful, positive personality attracted many friends. He was involved in several community groups such as Texaquatics Diving Club, Chamber of Commerce, Legion, Power Squadron, Boy Scouts, Van

Anda TV Association and, to our benefit, the Texada Heritage Society in which he was a founding member, later serving as Treasurer.

In recent years Pete became the "guru" of our Wednesday morning museum work sessions, dispensing knowledge with humour and always ready with a story.

Pete says, "The people of Texada have been so good to me and I've tried to return it. I like people. They are the most important thing in our lives."

We wish Pete a bright future in his new home in Powell River and thank him for his years of dedication to the island and to our museum. We miss him already.



Spring has arrived at Texada school! Students have been busy with their

rotations of ceramics (with the help of the Texada Ceramics group – thank you so much for your hard work and support!), gardening, and cooking. We are also planning for the coming school year!

In April, students wrote short letters in earnest advocating the changes they want to see at the school. With a few edits for clarity, here were some highlights. Please enjoy. More screen time and computer time was a big one. The most convincing is featured below:

> "Students would feel much better if we could have more computer time. If we could have some computer time at the first recess then the teachers have more time to work, eat, and then four Educational Assistant] has less kids to look after. Conclusion: It would make us really happy if you let us."

Another advocated for some construction at the school specifically to put in a parkour park at the school and a water fountain installed directly in the classroom. Respectively:

"We should put a parkour [gym in]. It will help [me] calm down. If we take out the stage wall then we can put in the parkour gym. It will be good for the school. That's why we should have a parkour gym." "I think we should put a fountain in our room. We should get one so we don't have to walk all the way down the hall. It would save the wait for a sip of water. We could take out the sink and put in the fountain because it's already all hooked up."

Controversially, a student advocating for wanting more cursive lessons:

> "This is why; because [we] could write letters and write faster. Everybody will write good cursive. Everybody will have fun with cursive. I wish [we could] have fun learning [with] cursive lessons!!!!!"

Lastly, a student advocating for LONGER school days (that must be a good sign!):

> "We should make longer days. If we have longer days, we will get smarter faster. Parents will get more time. I hope school days get longer."

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

My feelings are mixed regarding the qRD's 2024 operating budget and five-year capital plan. While I'm satisfied that our tax dollars are being spent according to Board policy and that the budget is as lean as possible, I'm not happy about the upcoming property tax increase. I'm also not happy that the significant one-time costs hitting the qRD this year have driven many new projects to the back burner for now.

In area D, the residential property tax rate per \$100,000 in assessed value for 2024 is \$204.89, up from \$181.31 last year. Mitigating this somewhat is the reduction in many property assessments. In 2023, the average residential property was valued at \$416,807, dropping to \$407,876 this year. If your home is assessed at \$400,000 your property taxes will be roughly four times the tax rate.

The biggest driver of the tax hike is the completion and start-up of the Resource Recovery Centre. Although I haven't supported this project, I admit it will be an important facility, consolidating solid waste for the region. It will include public greenspace and a "free store" for reusable goods. Another cost in 2024 is the expansion of office space to relieve cramped working conditions and meet new provincial accessibility requirements. Based on our population, Texada taxpayers pay about six per cent of regionwide expenditures.

In total, the operating budget is set at \$15.6 million while capital spending will be \$8.5 million in 2024.

On-island, the Board voted to keep the Shelter Point Park concession open and the successful bidder should be known soon. The tennis courts will be refinished, a new gate installed at the VA ball field, and re-surfacing is planned for Emily Lake Trail. Regionally, the FireSmart program will continue, as well as accessibility improvements to RD facilities.

In all, we pay for three different types of services. **Regional services** include parks, cemeteries, animal shelter, waste management and emergency management. Shared services include planning/development, paratransit, septage disposal and the PR Li-

brary, which provides funding for our Texada Library. Area D services are the Recreation Passenger • Cargo Commission, Heritage Commission, airport, VA dock, Health Clinic and emergency road rescue.

A Prospectors Tale

In the Spring of '82 I found myself high in the mountains north of Germanson Landing B.C. at a place called Moose Lake. In the morning, with the sound of chopper blades spinning, we were ready to depart our spartan camp to prospect an area known geologically to host precious metals, namely gold.

Two other geologists and myself took off on separate traverses to map and sample different locations. My area started on a treeless saddle dividing two separate valleys high in the mountains. As the chopper left me, I had one last look down the painted valley before I started my traverse down the other side.

That last look sent shivers up my spine as I could see a grizzly, at the gallop, charging up the draw towards me. What to do? No firearm, a pocket full of bear bangers and a rock hammer. I dropped my pack sack on the spot to distract the bear and headed off to my right towards a collapsed cliff of boxcar sized boulders thinking I could hide amongst them.

The grizzly was at my pack standing on his hind legs, its upturned nose sucking in the air trying to locate the owner's location.

Climbing over the massive boulders looking for a place to hide I spotted a crack, perhaps a cave, in the cliff face ahead. I reached the crack with the grizzly still in tracking pursuit standing and sniffing the air every so often.

The crack measured about a foot and a half across and four feet deep pinching out behind me. Loose gravel debris spilled out at my feet as I pushed myself in as far as humanly possible. This was by no means a safe spot but the best I could find in the short time I had.

A few minutes passed and I could hear the grizzly's breath above me where the crack had pinched out at the cliff surface. My knees were knocking, heart pounding I could hardly stand and thinking what my family would say when they heard the news. Minutes passed, then an hour, I had no recollection of time before I had the courage to come out and look around.

As the sun was getting lower on the horizon I made the dash for my pack sack and ran as fast as possible down the mountain to the river below. Within minutes the sound of chopper blades in the air my rescue had come. That was the last job I ever did without packing protection. Nature has a way of setting your priorities in order. Cheers, Coyote

There is no fee to register, and you can do this online by visiting the qathet Regional Emergency Services website at qathet.ca/emergency-preparedness.

The qathet Regional Emergency Preparedness Program emphasizes the importance of staying well-informed during emergencies. In times of crisis, timely and accurate information can mean the difference between safety and harm, making it imperative for individuals to remain updated and aware of unfolding events.

To assist information sharing with residents and visitors, the Program utilizes a mass notification tool known as the Community Notification System. This system enables emergency management personnel to promptly communicate potentially life-saving information, such as Evacuation Alerts and Orders, to registered individuals through various channels, including email, voice calls, and text messages.

Spring means burning bans

We hope that those of you who attended the Texada Community Emergency Preparedness Fair on April 14th had an opportunity to get your questions answered. One topic that we heard repeatedly was people's concerns about the potential for wildfire when forecasts are for a hotter and drier summer. Your fire departments are doing what we can to prepare, but residents need to do their bit as well. Both communities will be implementing fire bans by at least May 15th (and if it continues to be hot and dry we may even have to impose the ban earlier).

What the fire ban means is no open burning between May 15th and October 15th (and that date could be extended if needed) within in the Improvement District boundaries. Outside the Districts bans are imposed when required by BC Forestry. But authority to impose a fire ban inside the Districts rests with the Improvement District, and NOT the Provincial Government. The firefighters who attend an illegal fire are really not impressed by the excuse, "but the BC Wildfire website said it was OK to burn". The main difference between Van Anda and Gillies Bay is that Gillies Bay will continue to allow campfires until conditions become extreme. The reason for that is that with Shelter Point Campground allowing campfires it is hard to justify not allow residents to have a campfire on their own property. Just remember that the rules for a campfire are strict. No more than a half meter in height and in a contained area, a source of water on hand, and it must be attended at all times.

Last summer residents were very conscientious. We were only called out on a few occasions. Lets see if we can do even better this year.

Not quite Hunter S. or Ken Kesey's Merry Pranksters, but a slightly less frenzied 'trip' through a time when hitchhik-


