Texada Island's very own Jane Waterman was one of four gathet region residents who were honoured with a King Charles III Coronation Medal during a special ceremony at Tla'amin Nation's Salish Centre on March 8. Powell River MP Rachel Blaney presided over the ceremony.

Jane Waterman has worked tirelessly to provide restorative justice services to the gathet region since 2004.

She was an integral player in starting the Texada Island Restorative Justice Program and has been volunteering for 20 years as a caseworker, coordinator and board chair, Her

colleagues see Waterman as an unbelievable advocate for community building and iustice, who leads from behind with strenath, perseverance and humility.

Waterman has advocated for restorative justice services stating that: "If the youth are willing to take responsibility for their actions, restorative justice is a very good avenue to take. Restorative justice can reduce costs. and, in the end, promotes public safety by providing healing, reparation and reintegration into the community."

The benefits to those affected in her community have been realized given her steadfast dedication to this cause.

Twenty-two recipients in Blaney's riding received one of the 30,000 medals given out to Canadians who have made a significant contribution to Canada, or to a particular province, territory, region or community of Canada, or have made an outstanding achievement abroad that brings credit to Canada.





I eventually reset the fuse of the controlled blast and afterwards set my young crew of students to work shoveling out the drill pad.

The next day, to take a stress related break, I left my crew of students to finish up levelling out the blasted drill site, while I took the day to prospect.

My traverse took me across a ravine where I could look back at the young students while they were cleaning out the drill pad. As I glanced over I could see them jumping up and down, shouting and waving their arms and shovels. Geez, look at them I thought,

acting like juveniles pretending to be working... I waved back at them and continued my traverse up and over the hill prospecting.

At the end of the day the chopper had picked me up and returned me back to camp. Just as the chopper landed the students ran up to me and shouted, "you're safe, thank God!"

"What the heck are you talking about," I said.

"Didn't you see the grizzly following you up and over the hill?" they said.

Lucky I didn't stop for lunch, I thought... and maybe the students weren't as juvenile as I first thought.

I just shrugged it off with bravado and said, "sure I saw him, the idea is to remain calm and not to panic." But, my heart was in my throat just thinking about it.

It was surely a happy ending on both accounts.

The extent of beach-cast seaweed and other matter called wrack is affected by oceanic currents, winds, tides and surf. Above the high tide line, black nori, bladderwrack, sea lettuce, various kelps such as sugar kelp and

bull kelp fronds wash up on our beaches, mostly during the stormy season from November to March.

Besides its use as a fertilizer. Amanda Swinimer's book "The Science and Spirit of Seaweed" is an excellent resource for the diverse culinary and health benefits of seaweed!

November is the best month to harvest seaweed for your garden as herring spawn on seaweed during February, March,

and April and must be left undisturbed, as well as the sand and gravel beneath the seaweed. When harvesting, please take small amounts from various locations on the beach and leave some seaweed, there are diverse groups of organisms that still live and feed on it.

It is excellent for roses, veggie beds,

> flower pots, and around the drip line of trees. Within 36 hours of collecting, heap seaweed directly onto the surface about 2-3 inches thick (some say 4-6 inches) and let it rot down into the soil. No need to wash off the salt.

> It may also be added to your regular compost or brewed into seaweed "tea" by adding water to a bucket of seaweed and letting it sit in the sun, covered for a few days. The

(stinky) liquid can then be used as a spray or applied directly to the soil around seedlings.

Texada Museum....History Below the Tide

Visitors to many beaches along Texada's west shores can't miss the semi-circular ridges of rocks that slowly reveal themselves at low tide. Most recognize these as the remains of First Nations' fish weirs designed to corral salmon into the rock ponds where they can be more easily speared as they approach spawning creeks.



They are the most obvious evidence of historical First Nations enterprise on Texada.

In some places, though, similar rock enclosures serve a different purpose. These encircle flatter, mainly sandy/gravelly areas on the lower edge of the beaches and are, in fact, gardens for cultivating clams. Although they have been in use for millennia, these "clam gardens" were only "discovered" by the established scientific community within the last 30 years!

Rocks were cleared from patches of flat, sandy beach areas and were stacked parallel to the shore. This increased the usable area for clam production and helped prevent wave erosion.

Over time the gardens, with careful tending, became full of "biogenetic sand" (pieces of clamshell amid rich decomposition). The people created an ideal habitat for butter clams, originally the main harvest.

Clams were dug by women and children using a metre-long ironwood or yew stick and collected in woven cedar baskets worn on their backs. Clams were steamed over hot campfire rocks in a fern-lined pit covered with a mat.

The cooked clams were then dried and smoked beside the fire and threaded onto sticks (from the ocean spray bush). Smoked clams lasted a long time and were a valuable source of winter nutrition as well as a convenient food for travel and trade.

At Shelter Point the extensive buried remnants of ancient fires and discarded shells (middens) are modern day evidence of the historical importance of First Nations mariculture on Texada.



species pairs. At the dock, the group conducted a visual survey of the plants, looking for invasive species and observing the dominant plant species in the area.








Application for a Permit under the provisions of the Environmental Management Act

We, Zyrox Mining Company Ltd., PO Box 2078 Station Terminal, Vancouver, BC, V6B3S3, are seeking provincial authorization pursuant to the Environmental Management Act for current effluent discharges from the Yew/Bolivar Mine and Mill sites. The source(s) of seasonal discharge are seepage from the Bolivar Mill tailings storage facility, seepage from the North Pit Pond, and discharge from the lined South Pit Pond.

The sites upon which the facilities are located where the discharges occur are the Yew Mine and Bolivar Mill. The Yew Mine (PID# 015-794-717, DL 530, LAP NO.8 FRACTON MC) is located 500 m south of the Blubber Bay / Gillies Bay Road intersection and is within the Van Anda watershed downstream of the community water supply (Priest Lake Watershed). The Bolivar Mill (PID# 015-794-890, District Lot 17) is located within the Texada Island District, 200 meters from the Blubber Bay Road and Crescent Bay Road intersection.

The maximum rate of effluent discharged from Yew Mine's South Pit Pond is 470 cubic meters per day when discharging seasonally while the other seepage is continuous. Occasionally lime application is the treatment applied to the North Pit Pond and once suspended solids are settled and the effluent meets discharge limits, the effluent will be discharged from the lined South Pit Pond to ground. Seepage from the historic tailings storage facility at the Bolivar Mill is considered as a discharge. Groundwater and surface water monitoring will continue to be conducted to confirm the water quality downgradient of the Yew Mine and Bolivar Mill.

Any person who may be adversely affected by the current discharge and wishes to provide relevant information may, within 30 days after the last date of posting, publishing, service or display, send written comments to the applicant, with a copy to the Director, Environmental Protection at ENV.MiningAuthorizations@gov.bc.ca. The identity of any respondents and the contents of anything submitted in relation to this application will become part of the public record.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT, Area D

With all that's going on at national and international levels, the work of the regional district hardly seems significant. But even amid uncertainty, local governments carry on delivering services and the qRD is no different.

2025 BUDGET

This month there are a number of things to report. Most importantly, the **2025 budget** was still being worked on at press time, so full details will appear here next month. Tentatively, our residential property tax rate (per \$100,000 of assessed value) is expected to rise from \$204.89 last year to \$217.66 in 2025. Directors have asked for some changes, so hopefully this number can come down a bit before final approval.

POCOHONTAS BAY AND MOUNT POCOHONTAS NAME CHANGE

Recently the qRD received notice from the BC Geographical Names Office that two **place names** on Texada have changed. Pocohontas Bay, which is Tla'Amin Nation territory, is now "lexwamen," pronounced lehxwah-men and Mount Pocohontas is now "seteqwan," pronounced sheh-teh-qwan. The changes were requested by Tla'Amin Nation.

MLA RANDENE NEILL

Earlier this year the qRD met with our **new MLA**, **Randene Neill**, to advocate for some issues of concern. These included badlyneeded provincial support for improvement districts and their water systems and recycling options for industrial, commercial and institutional waste. She indicated a particular interest in resolving the decadeslong ID water system conundrum. Stay tuned.

BUILDING ASSESSMENTS

At the recommendation of our Recreation

Commission, the qRD had building assessments done of both the **Community Hall** and the **Old School** to determine how the costs of repairing and maintaining the old buildings compared with new construction. The results were very similar. Over a 30-year-period the cost of keeping the two buildings was estimated at \$3.8 million, while it would be \$3.6 million for a new combined facility with less space. No brainer. The old buildings stay and grant funding will be sought for needed repairs.

COMMUNITY WOOD SMOKE REDUCTION PROGRAM

Finally, with grant funding from Victoria and the BC Lung Foundation, the qRD will continue to offer the **Community Wood Smoke Reduction Program**. This incentive program provides rebates of up to \$1,500 on a first-come basis for homeowners to replace old, smoky wood stoves with less-polluting alternatives, including cleaner wood-burning appliances, pellet stoves and heat pumps. Contact the qRD for more info.

Hello Texada! Here are some notes on recent events:

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING will be held on Saturday April 26, 9.30 at the Legion in Van Anda. Reports and draft financials will be available on the website and at the office the week before. If you believe changes are needed, come to the AGM! This year, there will be either one or two Trustee positions for election. Do you or anyone you know want to be part of managing these important resources?

LEAK REPAIR SUCCESS! Recent repairs completed on Sturt Bay Rd and Smelter Rd, along with the 3 leaking hydrants temporarily shut off, have decreased water usage by more than half!!! These locations were identified by Velocity Water Service's leak detection in early January and were not where we expected. The resulting savings on water treatment expendables such as filters, salt, hydro, and chlorine will pay for the service in a short time. We will have more accurate volumes to share after the next monthly analysis of the data logged at the plant.

WATER OPERATOR TRUCK: VAID has purchased a pickup truck for water operator use. Thanks to the generosity of community members, the purchase cost was covered. Analysis of expenses show that expenditure will be less than the mileage amount currently being paid to employees. Additionally, regularly used tools, fittings, and supplies can be stocked in the truck for improved work efficiency.


