Minutes Are Precious

We hope you had a pleasant and safe holiday season. While you are making your New Year's Resolutions, we suggest to include ensuring your street address is clearly visible.

We have written before about the need to make sure we can find you in the dark. When you are in a situation where you have to call for help, we know every minute is going to seem like an eternity. If First Responders are driving up and down your street looking for house numbers, it might take several of those minutes to find the right house.

In larger communities, fire vehicles are equipped with on-board computers that can pin point your address (if you actually have a registered address, which is a whole other topic). We don't have that type of expensive technology on our trucks on Texada. We rely on paper maps and street addresses.

So we are asking, as part of your New Year's preparation, that you go out on to your street when it is dark, and look at your house number. Can you see it easily? Or is it, like many house numbers in our communities, not easy to see? Do you have dark numbers attached to a dark coloured fence post? Or numbers attached to your porch where there is no light? Is it oriented to the road? Is the address obscured by vegetation?

All of these are issues we have had to deal with recently. If you have trouble seeing your address number, imagine how challenging it is for First Responders who are driving by in a truck, not knowing who they are going to assist.

Ideally your house numbers should be large, reflective, and near the road—not by your door. Some hardware stores stock the materials for these type of house numbers. Also, in Powell River, Impact Signs could make you a proper street address sign.







More Fun Texada History Facts...

DID YOU KNOW ...large black kettles seen by settler John Edwards on the beach at Blubber Bay in 1890 were what remained of a once-thriving whaling industry. These "try pots" were placed over a fire to render whale blubber into oil. In the 1800's whaling was a

significant industry on the BC coast until the introduction of steampowered boats and explosive harpoon heads wiped out most of the Salish Sea populations.

...logging on Texada helped finance the luxurious lifestyle of a German prince and his teenage bride. Prince Johannes von Thurn n Taxis bought

Texada Logging in 1965 and purchased many other Texada properties as well. Known as "Johnny TNT" the Prince (52) married the 19-year old Gloria Maria (nicknamed "the Punk Princess") and together they lived the international jet-set lifestyle.

When Johnny died in 1990 Gloria was surprised to find a mountain of accumulated debt. She was forced to sell off most of their world-wide properties (including Texada parcels), her jewels, art and 24 of their cars.

...a world class hotel once graced the hilltop at Sturt Bay. "One of the finest stopping places on the coast," the Marble Bay Hotel became a social hub hosting Saturday night dances and community celebrations. When the local mines closed in 1919 the hotel was abandoned and left to its fate ("recycling").

...Texada has had the honour to host "royalty" - a princess and an empress! The elegant CPR wooden steamship, Princess Beatrice (built in 1903), now rests in

> peace in Mouat Bay. She's buried under rock and rubble as foundation for the breakwater that logger Charlie Klein built in the 1930's. The other royal presence was the "beating heart" of the CP ocean liner Empress of Japan her 600-lb brass bell which once rang out from the tower at Blubber Bay school. Unfor-



tunately the bell was sent to the Vancouver Maritime Museum where it now rests in silence.


- Check in on neighbors to ensure they are warm enough. Especially if the weather does turn particularly cold.

More Coyote Tales—Whitewater

The turbo Beaver float plane sat idle beside the dock in Gold River. I had hired the plane and pilot to fly me up the West Coast of B.C. to a remote area to stake a claim on a favourable geological setting to prospect the

following Spring. The water was calm the skies were blue, claim tags, axe, pack sack and hard hat equipped, I was ready to go.

The young pilot said, "there might be a little rough weather up ahead", as we took off, "but nothing really to worry about"... and down the Inlet we soared and into the wild blue we flew.

Within a half an hour a turbulent wind had picked up and I tightened my seat belt snug. I was wearing headphones, along with the pilot, when a crackling message came through that a boat was in distress in some white water around Esperanza. I nodded to the pilot that I understood as he circled around to get lower and search further up along the coast. The wind had picked up violently now as we flew lower in our search. I was holding on to the extended strap of my seatbelt like a bull rider at a rodeo as my head was bouncing off the cockpit roof and side window of the plane's cabin.

Just as the pilot circled once more, the plane started to shake violently. I could see the wings flapping up and down like a bird in flight and the float pontoons moving in and out so rapidly I was wondering if the plane was going to blow apart. The ocean waves had blown flat and were now long white streaks and foam. The young pilot's face was white as snow as he turned to me and said, "we've got to put her down".

Where the hell was he gonna do that, I thought, as I looked out the window at the white water crashing on the towering rock pinnacles scattered about. If he puts this plane down in that... we're done for.

Lower and lower we flew as the pilot searched for a place to ditch that would be the least catastrophic. "Oh hell" the young pilot screamed into the mic, as he reached down

and pulled on the pontoon's rudder cable that had come loose. It was the downed rudders that caught the wind and nearly tore us apart.

The pilot was so shaken that he turned into Tahsis Inlet to tie up at the wharf and overnight while the wind blew itself out.

"Thank goodness you're a seasoned prospector and used to these kinda things" he said. I just shook my head up and down. I could hardly walk the dock, my knees so weak and shaking with cold sweat down my back as I said, "yup... just a little breeze, another day at the office".

Building Bridges:

Not too long ago, the BC Museum in Victoria hosted a display highlighting the work of Leonardo da Vinci. In the museum gift shop, there was a small kit of wood dowels that could be assembled into a bridge structure. This "emergency bridge" was designed by da Vinci around

1487, in Milan. The design is such that when weight is applied to it, it gets stronger.

I bought and assembled the bridge model and decided it would be fun to build a bigger bridge, following the design. I purchased "pointy posts" from the lumber yard (6' long by 3-1/2" diameter posts). I cut off the points and used the posts to build the bridge structure.

da Vinci's design used local trees and lash the members together. I used pressuretreated posts and bolted them together, to make a more permanent structure. I then added decking, and a railing on one side. For the railing, I cut two live cedar branches and peeled them. I bent the branches around the trunk of a large fir tree, using a block and tackle, to give them a bow shape to match the arch of the bridge. The finished bridge is 12' long by 4' wide, supported by concrete blocks to keep the posts above the dirt.

A friend noted that the bridge was a folly

that "starts from nowhere, goes over nothing and ends nowhere." To remedy this, I dug out the dirt under the bridge and placed rocks to form a dry riverbed. I also built a path leading to the bridge and continuing on to a playhouse. It now had a purpose! The path goes to a bridge, over a dry river and provides access to a playhouse!

I think the bridge is a nice addition to the garden and compliments the fish pond beside it. Shouldn't everyone have a bridge?!

DIRECTOR'S REPORT, Area D

Happy New Year!

Starting with a clean slate is what new years are about and that's certainly the case where grants-in-aid (GIAs) from the qRD are concerned. Every year grants are available to island groups and organizations for the betterment of the community. These funds can be for specific projects, events or capital improvements.

There are two "intakes" for applications for grants with firm deadlines of March 31 for the first round and Aug. 31 for the second.

There's always more money available at the start of the year, so if your community group could use some financial assistance, get your application in early.

Last year, five Texada organizations received GIAs: TACT (\$12.000), TINSHS (\$25,000), Sandcastle (\$3,000), Texada Health Services Society (\$2,286 toward the cancer support program) and the Royal Canadian Legion, Texada Branch (\$3,289 for exterior lighting).

Additionally, we contributed along with other areas of the qRD, to regional groups and events including PRISMA, Tourism PR, qathet Festival of the Performing Arts, qathet Arts Council and the Four Tides Hospice Society.

There are two streams of grants-in-aid: general, paid for by all residents of the qRD including the city, and area, for projects or events which benefit only one area, paid for by the taxpayers of that area.

"Tomorrow is the first blank page of a 365-page book. Write a good one." - Brad Paisley Previous social planning and economic development funding streams have been rolled into GIAs to make applying easier.

In the 2024 budget, area D had \$28,456 in our area GIA account, while there was \$96,000 in general GIA funding available. That total represents what taxpayers previously contributed to GIAs, social planning and economic development together. Area D's account had 27 cents left at the end of 2024, while there is \$19.80 left in the general GIA account. The 2025 budget is not yet set, but I expect it will be fairly similar to last year.

The point of these grants is to support the community with funding which could otherwise be unattainable. Typically, GIAs cover 25 per cent of the cost of a project, event or capital improvement. These funds help to make things happen, so if your group needs money, please apply. Call or email the qRD to receive the application form, administration@qathet.ca, or 604-485-2260.

ANNUAL INVOICES for Water Tolls and Parcel Taxes are being mailed (and emailed if previously requested) early January. Please let us know if you would like yours to be emailed or have changed your mailing address. Due date for payment is March 10, after which penalties are applied. Payment plans are available – see your invoice for details or contact us for more information or assistance in setting up a plan. To learn more about how Tolls & Taxes are calculated, visit our webpage vananda-id.ca/water-rates/

EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBER: A slip is included with your invoice for your emergency contact info. Please return this to us so we can contact you when needed. When we don't have your phone number, we can't let you know what's happening in emergencies.

LEAK DETECTION CONTRACTOR: Due to the massive loss of treated water from leaks in the infrastructure, we have contracted a leak detection specialist, who will be here Jan 6-9. They will set up acoustic devices around town to collect information that will then be analyzed to pinpoint leak locations. Unless we can cut down on water loss before summer, the treatment plant may need to be bypassed to keep water flowing in the pipes and in the storage tank for fire protection.

WATER QUALITY ADVISORY: The Water Quality Advisory continues. This will likely stay in effect until the media replacement in the ion exchange units is complete, which will allow the UV Treatment to be fully effective. The media

(Purolite) has a limited lifespan and high cost, and due to media deterioration and fouling, the ion exchangers are offline. Replacement of the media has been contracted to Aaron Service and is scheduled for late December 2024; however, the ion exchangers may possibly not be put back online until enough leaks are found and repaired as there are limits to the rate at which the ion exchangers can treat the water.

CHLORINE LEVELS: Unexpected changes in chlorine levels were caused by the faulty chlorine analyzer. This is being replaced early 2025. The entire chlorination system is outdated and will be all new as part of the Water Treatment Plant upgrades scheduled for completion summer 2025. This upgrade includes addition of a sand filter, which will lower treatment costs by saving on filter cartridges, salt used in the ion exchanger, and wear and tear on the ion exchanger media.




