



Off we rode with me jammed in the back between two burley indigenous locals,


rifle barrels sticking out the windows, and me silently holding on to the broken alternator bracket.

BC Ferry Advisory Committee Says Farewell


Well everyone, BC Ferries has done it again.

ABOUT TOMATOES

Today tomatoes are one of the most popular garden crops, but it wasn't always so. The ancestor of our modern tomato was a tiny scrambling vine native to the highlands of Peru. Archaeological evidence suggests they were harvested for their small green berries.

The tomato was domesticated by the

Aztecs and made its way to Europe with Columbus and Cortez at the dawn of the 16th century. Though grown as a staple crop in the Mediterranean for centuries, the British did not consider the tomato as a food until the 18th century.

Over time it has spread to gardens all around the world. Many cultures have grown tomatoes and those heirloom varieties have been passed down through generations. The easy breeding of tomatoes has led to the wealth of wonderful varieties, shapes, colours, sizes and flavours available today.

My husband and I had an interesting experience while visiting the Galapagos Islands a few years ago. One fellow in our



group was the retired curator of the Kew Gardens (London) and, while hiking, he was thrilled to discover one of the original tomato plants growing wild amongst the volcanic rock. It was, indeed, tiny with small flowers and pea-sized fruits. We marveled that this best of all garden crops had such humble beginnings.

My mother loved tomatoes and used to talk fondly of her girlhood memories of being with her dad in his garden

and tasting his fantastic tomatoes. Eighty years later, she joined me in my garden while I was harvesting tomatoes. Eating one, then another, she reveled in their marvelous flavours. She had come full circle.

So when I'm in my tomato patch I think of her.

MUSEUM MUSINGS texada forever - garbage never

"It's the biggest turnout I've seen. I guess all the island's here," said long-time Texada resident Joe Christensen.

On November 9, 1982, hundreds of Texadans — from a 6-day-old newborn to 94year-old Bill Young — surrounded a bus carrying a Vancouver delegation as it inched toward the Texada Legion hall. Businesses had allowed their employees time off to attend the afternoon rally. Parents brought their children from school.

All were united in demonstrating opposition to the Genstar Company's plan to fill the former BC Cement quarry in Blubber Bay with one-quarter million tons of Vancouver's garbage yearly. Chants of "Texada Forever, Garbage Never" and "Keep Your Garbage" greeted Greater Vancouver Regional District (GVRD) representatives as they approached the meeting area.

Genstar had proposed a quick-fix solution to Greater Vancouver's growing garbage problem - dump it on Texada. The GVRD reps were here to assess the situation. They got an earful.

Once news of Genstar's plan was revealed in September 1982, Texada citizens sprang into action. A public meeting resulted in the formation of the Texada Action Now (TAN) committee to fight the proposal. Support was readily garnered from all the local (and Powell River) organizations and businesses as well as from other BC regional governments.

Door-to-door canvassers spread out across Texada and Powell River collecting thousands of signatures on a petition. Media were contacted and the issue was kept in the provincial spotlight. Backing for the campaign was tremendous. "I've never seen such a show of support on an issue," said MLA Don Lockstead.

Thanks to the island's united citizenry and the skilful leadership by TAN, the GVRD finally voted down Genstar's proposal 40 to 27 (January 1983).

TAN spokesperson Chuck Childress commented: "We didn't hit anybody over the head, we didn't blow anything up. We used responsible citizenship and we maintained our credibility throughout."


Islanders were not about to be bribed by the swimming pool and golf course offered by Genstar. As the Powell River News editorialized: "The island ... showed a spirit and unity of purpose that many communities would have trouble duplicating."



DIRECTOR'S REPORT, Area D

SAVING LOT 6 AS TEXADA KNOW'S IT

If you value keeping Lot 6 available for finding usable metal materials, read on. This continued use is again in jeopardy and you can help convince the qRD Board to maintain our existing salvaging/repurposing practice.

Lot 6 (aka the Metal Transfer Station) (aka "the mall") is included in proposed updates to the aRD Solid Waste Regulation and Tipping Fee Bylaw, which is primarily intended to govern the new Resource Recovery Centre (RRC). However, one proposed revision creates a substantial change in our long-standing use of Lot 6: "no person shall scavenge or salvage or remove material deposited at solid waste facilities unless approved by the supervisor or manager." This would reduce salvaging opportunities to the four days per month Lot 6 is open. This may make sense at the RRC, which is open on work days and will eventually have a "free store," but not here, and I'm pushing to have Lot 6 exempted from this provision.

Helping to convince the rest of the Board is where you come in. Tell directors how you feel about this proposed change. Please write a letter and send it in by June 5 for consideration at the **qRD Board meeting June 10**. Address it to Chair Clayton Brander and the qRD Board of Directors and send to administration@qathet.ca, with a copy to me. This bylaw change will be considered earlier at Committee of the Whole June 4, 1pm.

If you're reading this before then, you could ask to speak to the committee (virtually or in-person) as an unregistered (late) delegation. To do this, contact Michelle Jones, mjones@qathet.ca,

For decades, the "mall" has been the source of replacement parts for everything from lawnmowers and bicycles to dishwashers and beach umbrellas. By repurposing usable materials, we:

- save trips to PR reducing our carbon footprint
- reduce waste
- save qRD costs for removing deposited goods
- find replacement parts which may no longer be available
- find parts quickly, reducing equipment down time, and much more

This issue is reminiscent of another staff initiative in 2020 to completely fence Lot 6, citing liability concerns. My arguments, bolstered by many community complaints, narrowly defeated that proposal, with directors accepting that some level of liability risk is acceptable, in balance with community values. Expressing your concerns to the Board about this current initiative will influence its outcome.

Land Clearing, Septic Installation, Skidsteer, Excavating Work and Hauling



Saturday, April 26th, Texada NatureKids explored the Jungle Trail and the beginning of the Deep Woods Trail on Texada Island.

A big thank you to those who created these remarkable trails! We began with a round of introductions, a welcome song, and by sharing from our NatureWild library of spare magazines.

Along the trail, Texada NatureKids stopped to observe fresh signs of beaver activity. We also examined a beaver skull with its distinctive orangey teeth, colored and strengthened by iron. We took a break for some mint tea and a nibble of licorice fern root. Our "plant of the day" was devil's club — a shrub that grows up to 1.5 meters tall,



typically found in moist forests like the Jungle Trail.

During the safety talk, NatureKids were reminded to avoid touching the plant's brittle yellow spines, which easily break off and can irritate the skin. Traditionally, Haida peoples have used devil's



club rhizomes as medicine to treat ailments such as adult-onset diabetes and rheumatoid arthritis.

Throughout the hike, we discovered many natural wonders, including mushrooms, caterpillars, spiders, beautiful beetles, flying insects, and more! We also learned about the connection between black bears waking up in spring and seeking out skunk cabbage as an early food source.

After finding a lovely spot for lunch, we wrapped up the day's adventure. Many couldn't resist the call of the low tide and took the opportunity to explore the shores of Gillies Bay.

Thank you to everyone who came out to enjoy a spectacular explore!



GILLIES BAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Our Annual General Meeting on May 4th was interrupted by a bushfire. Six firefighters promptly departed to address the situation, with additional personnel arriving shortly after to assist. While the fire was swiftly brought under control and extinguished, this provided a firsthand observation of our firefighters efficiency and professionalism. Witnessing their coordinated efforts underscored the dedication and discipline inherent in their operations deepening our collective appreciation for their service.

Following the incident, the meeting proceeded with a constructive and focused discussion. Key outcomes included:

- Firefighters honorarium: A motion was passed to explore the feasibility of providing honoraria or compensation to our firefighters.
- Water source planning: Long term planning for sustainable water sources is required.



- Grant funding: Emphasis was placed on pursuing available grant funding.
- Tax rate projections: A proposal was made to publish a five year projection of tax rates to enhance ratepaver financial planning.

These discussions and decisions will auide future trustee deliberations. Trustees Keith Franklin and Carolanne White were acclaimed to another three year term. The informal yet constructive atmosphere fostered open dialogue and thoughtful critique, contributing to a productive session. We look forward to reporting on the progress of these initiatives at next year's meetina.



VAN ANDA IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Hello Texada! Here are some notes on recent events:

METER PILOT PROGRAM: We have received funding from the Province of BC to cover all costs of installing meters to all connections, including the components needed for automated data collection. An informational community meeting was held on May 22. We have made a new webpage to share information on the project and address any concerns -

Some background: The Provincial Government Budget 2024 committed to new measures to help mitigate and better respond to the impacts of climate emergencies. Priority infrastructure projects and proarams to decrease flood risks and strengthen drought resiliency were highlighted. This included \$50 million for a Water Meter Pilot Program to help fund metering projects in smaller communities throughout BC. Assistance on planning, purchasing, and implementation is being provided by KWL and Econics.

BURN BAN began May 15; includes burn barrels. New for 2025: campfires for cooking and heat are allowed if under 18" x 18" (45 cm) with hose or pail of water on hand. Our Fire Restrictions webpage has links to the updated Bylaw as well as Coastal Fire Bans and a map with Fire Danger Rating for BC vananda-id.ca/fire-restrictions/

WATER RESTRICTIONS: Changes made for 2025: Stage 1 began May 15 and Stage 2 begins on Jul 1.

Stage 1 restricts lawn watering to once per week. Stage 2 further restricts lawn watering to one hour a day once per week and washing of outside surfaces to specific situations. Drip irrigation is never restricted. Full

detail of restrictions with a chart can be seen at vananda-id.ca/water-restrictions/

DRIP IRRIGATION PARTS: VAID will provide parts at wholesale cost to setup a drip irrigation system. To encourage water conservation, rainwater storage tanks also available at wholesale cost.
