

Horsefly

More Coyote Tales. . . Horsefly Lake

Joe Christensen was a prospector, inventor and all around handy man. When it came to choosing a partner to team up with on a remote field assignment he was your man. Dollars for donuts you could count on Joe.

We rented a boat from the owner of Horsefly Lake Lodge for the 50 km journey down the lake to prospect.

The East end of Horsefly Lake was geologically favourable for hosting large placer and lode gold deposits, our target area.

It was a barren and lonely landscape on that cool autumn morning when we set out travelling down the lake. As we landed and started prospecting Joe

and I were quick to note the quartz veining and altered greenstone and schist formations as we traversed the landscape prospecting. The day ended with our pack sacks loaded up with maps, rock and soil samples as we prepared for our return journey.

What! Boat won't start! battery dead! only one oar in the boat! Oh no! Quick as a squirrel Joe grabbed his sharpened axe and started hacking away at a small cedar tree. "Find some branches to make oar locks", he shouts. Desperately I scavenged material to make the boat seaworthy. I couldn't believe it, in no time Joe had carved and shaped a second oar from that cedar tree. We lashed Y shaped branches to the gunwales for oar locks and fashioned a make shift sail from chopped poles and a bright orange tarp we found. With a heave-ho we set out from shore rowing.

It was cold and wet as we swapped turns

rowing to keep warm but 50 km is a long way to row in a heavy boat. As night was falling around us we tried to navigate a short cut between a shallow strip of water and a rock isle. The shallow water beached the boat as we jumped in to lighten the load to free the boat.

We were exhausted, and now cold and wet but determined to push onward re-

gardless. Our lives depended on it.
Just at last light we could see a boat headed our way. A lone hunter had spotted our bright orange tarp sail and came out from shore to investigate. Lucky for us he had a generator and charger back at his camp.

We arrived late back at the Lodge ready to strangle the lodge owner as he forgot to tell us the alternator on the boat wasn't working. To make amends he kept Joe and I up the rest of the night with all the hot rum toddies we could drink and placed that wonderfully carved oar that Joe made above the fireplace mantle as a show piece as we toasted each other's good luck and fortune.

Needless to say, we didn't work the next two days, for medicinal reasons, and the last I heard, that carved oar still rests above the fireplace mantle with the owner still telling tall tales of two rough and tumble prospectors paddling their way back to the lodge, with that oar, in a near death icy blizzard.

It's funny how tales and stories get more colourful, exaggerated and mellow with age, kinda like wine, whiskey and gray whiskered old prospectors.



TEXADA ISLAND GARDEN CLUB

Please join us for our Garden Club meeting at the Gillies Bay Senior Center on Wednesday March 19th at 2pm. We will have a virtual tour of local gardens and we will also be sharing our seedlings and seeds! This month's article is from Shirley McCune who shares the story of her winter garden.

A Winter Garden is both structure and calm. I would like to tell you how I developed my dream oasis and how it came to be real over the years.

Express Lines

I built my house in 2007. Starting from scratch, I had a blank canvas. Using colour, shapes, shades, blooms and a vision, I now feel joy and gratitude in the long winter months. For 17 years I took my gravelly land and turned it into my sanctuary, where I can enjoy morning coffee, while contemplating my design and life, and watch the birds and insects enjoy it as well.

At first I chose deer resistant plants and shrubs; and after 10 years I was able to fence my small backyard. I used a layered lasagna garden approach: bark mulch, cardboard, seaweed and paper. As this decomposed, I was able to create whimsical islands of trees and shrubs. My inspiration was that of Tuscany. I loved the layers of tall Cypress and rolling hills.

The Hedge Cedars, lemon Cypress, dwarf pillar Ewes, column Boxwoods give height and structure. Bottom pruning Portuguese Laurel, Red Maple and Lilac give a decidu-

ous element of bare branches. Rounded shapes of blooming Heather, Hellebores, ferns, Rhododendron mimic the rolling hills.

In the winter the dark dirt is exposed enhances the colours of spiked yellow and gold grasses; like sunlight across the landscape contrasting with dark foliage. Climbing Hydrangeas, evergreen honeysuckle add texture with buds and flowers.

Then, bringing your eye down to ground level, little Cyclamens cavort with miniature Iris of different shades of colour along with Sassafras, sedums, snowdrops and Thyme.

I think the winter months are my favourite time of year. Nothing to do, nowhere to go, just...be.

My winter garden brings me peace.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT, Area D

Parkland is precious, even in communities like ours which abound with natural beauty. Protecting and preserving land with special features helps ensure that our quality of life can be enjoyed by future generations.

Opportunities to increase parkland are rare, but one such opportunity is now before us and you can help achieve this goal by commenting positively to the province by March 13.

The park in question is at Emily Lake (aka Turtle Lake), where the qRD, on the recommendation of our Recreation Commission, applied to expand the existing provincial Crown lease which constitutes the park. The qRD's application is to occupy the land for 30 years, to compliment the existing 30-year lease for the current park, which is 12.8 hectares in size. The expansion area is 164 hectares to include the complete area around Emily Lake and parts of VA Creek.

The application is now in Phase Two of Victoria's approval process, which is First Nations and public consultation. The expanded park is referenced in our OCP and is supported by Tla'Amin Nation.

The area contains majestic old growth, historical wooden water lines and is habitat for threatened species of stickleback and Western Painted Turtles. Within the VA watershed, the walking trail system is based on old, un-

maintained industrial roads from both mining and forestry. As a qRD park, these trails would be maintained, helping to prevent sedimentation from entering the watershed from failing trails and roads. And what an amazing recreational asset these 177 hectares of parkland would be for Texada!

The decision by the province could take up to three years, but now is the time the community can tell Victoria that we support this important park expansion. If you haven't yet been to Emily Lake Park, the best access and parking is in VA along Legion Road.

Special thanks to Terry Hollo for her vision and drive to protect this special area.


