Garden Club Notes

Please join us for our next Garden Club meeting on Wednesday February $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$, at 2 pm in the Community Hall. Dave Murphy will discuss soil amendment . You don't have to be a member to attend.

For our Valentine,s edition, Joyce Wiebe writes about the humble yet wonderful RED beet.

As a child, my first experiences with beets were in the delicious Ukrainian borscht my mother made. As an adult, I have enjoyed new experiences such as roasted beets, shredded raw beets on salad, and pickled beets; all with their gorgeous red color and rich flavour.

In the Ancient Middle East, beets were grown primarily for their greens. By Roman times they were also grown for the root. In the Middle Ages they were used for treating illnesses related to digestion and the blood.

Today we enjoy beet greens in salads, soups or steamed and we eat the roots roasted, boiled or raw. A serving of beets is high in fibre and vitamin C, folate, potassium, magnesium, iron and manganese. And, beets are one of the sweetest vegetables.

Beets are a cool weather crop and can be planted 2-3 weeks before the last average frost date in spring or in late summer for a fall crop. Beets can be red, orange, gold or even white! The roots can be a round ball or cylindrical (perfect for slicing and canning). Beets prefer well-worked soil rich in organic matter. Beets benefit from companion planting with garlic or onions. The wrinkled seed is actually a cluster of 2-5 inside so may need thinning. Soaking the seeds overnight speeds germination. For square foot gardening plant 9 seeds per square. Beets need an inch of water each week, so mulching is one way to help conserve moisture. Young beet leaves can be picked for tasty salads about one month after planting and beets store well for winter use. This month's recipe is a new dessert adventure, perfect for Valentine's Day!

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Chocolate Beet Cupcakes (from joythebaker.com)

1-cup flour

½ cup cocoa

½ tsp. baking soda

½ tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. salt

1-cup sugar

3 tbs melted butter

½ cup beet puree (roast beets, cool and puree)

1 cup buttermilk

1 egg

1 tsp. vanilla extract

In a large bowl whisk together flour, cocoa powder, baking soda, baking powder, salt and sugar. In a second bowl whisk together melted butter, beet puree, buttermilk, egg and vanilla. Add the liquids to the dry ingredients and mix till well incorporated. Divide batter between twelve muffin cups and bake for 20 minutes at 350 degrees. Ice with vanilla icing (for pink add 1 T of pureed beets). Enjoy!!

DIRECTORS REPORT

There are some good news items from the RD to report this month.

The first is a \$24,000 covered gathering structure for the VA ball field as a gift from Rotary Club International. The ball fields are among the RD properties on the island stewarded by the Texada Island Recreation Commission (TIRC).

Last year TIRC conducted an informal survey of new amenities people would like to have at the ball fields, triggered by concerns about the deterioration of both sets of bleachers. A covered gathering structure in VA was identified as a priority. When Rotary approached the RD, staff put forward the VA location.

Exactly where in the park it will go will be determined in consultation with TIRC and VAID. Construction will be later this year.

Thanks to both RD staff and Rotary.

Another piece of good news is adoption by the RD of a new Volunteer Program for regional parks, properties and trails. I asked for such a program last year when some local residents expressed their frustration at not being allowed to do trail clean-up at the park. The Board supported having a volunteer program and it started this month. Volunteers are now invited to come forward.

The CUPE-endorsed program will include ecological restoration, habitat enhancement, invasive plant removal, trail maintenance and garbage clean-ups. Properties on Texada include Shelter Point Park, Erickson's Beach, Woodlands Cemetery, Emily Lake Park and beach access points.

Interested volunteers can sign up for the program by filling out and submitting a qRD Parks, Properties and Trails Volunteer form, available at gathet.ca/services/parks-andrecreation/ You can request a paper copy from Operational Services staff at operations@gathet.ca or 604-487-1838.

In other news, the RD will continue the Wood Smoke Reduction Program in 2023. This year, residents have the option to keep their certified wood stove when installing a heat pump and still qualify for a rebate. Rebates range from \$400 to \$1,000. A total of \$10,250 is available on a first-come basis. Contact the qRD for more info, administration@gathet.ca, 604-485-2260.

MUSEUM MUSINGS

THE STROMBERGS

The Stromberg name appears frequently in Texada's history and lives today at Stromberg Falls, a spectacular seasonal cascade south of Davie Bay.

William Stromberg was born in Finland in 1867 and made his way by steamer via Cape Horn to San Francisco, then Vancouver, where he became foreman at the BC Sugar Refinery. In Vancouver he met an 18-year old Finnish girl, Emma Peterson. They married in 1898.

In 1900 the couple, with one-year old daughter Edith, relocated to Van Anda where William was employed by the Van Anda Copper and Gold Company.

He earned his engineer's ticket and was put in charge of the powerhouse at the Cornell and Copper Queen mines. A company house provided for married employees (still standing and occupied today) was their first abode.

In 1915 daughter Edith and her brother, Bill, travelled to Powell River to write the 3-day High School entrance exams. They were the first Texada kids to qualify, enabling them to attend King George High School in Vancouver.

Young Edith was adventurous. Bessie Banham, a friend Edith met at the Powell River exams, remembered joining Edith and Ethel Raper in an 8-mile cross-island backpacking trek to Gillies Bay. The girls camped on the

"unspoilt stretch of sandy beach" and marvelled as seals followed their rowboat.

Father William had prospected a bornite-rich karst area south of Davie Bay and registered several mineral claims there (naming them after his children). The Strombergs built a summer cabin on the beach where the creek meets the sea (today's "Secret Beach"). The family would row there from Gillies Bay at the start of each summer.

Edith (later married as Edith Poock) became a prominent and respected participant in Texada affairs, helping to establish TICS in 1930. She organized and

helped out with numerous church-based community activities over the years.

Mrs Poock retired to her beloved Gillies Bay beachfront where she hosted tea parties in her charming gardens. In 1980 at age 81 Edith sold her property to the McLeods with the proviso that she could remain there for the rest of her life.

Edith died 22 years later in 2002 at the age of 103!

Next month the reader will hear of father William's harrowing rowboat expedition to Haida Gwaii in 1903.

CANCER SUPPORT GROUP PROPOSED LOTTERY FUNDRAISER

The Texada Health Services Society is looking for ways to raise the amount of funds given to those individuals dealing with cancer within our community. To accomplish this, we need the support of the community. One of our concerned citizens brought the suggestion to us based on an existing lottery in a small community in Alberta that has been operating for a number of years and has been very successful. Before we attempt to duplicate their idea, we need to find out if our community has the desire to do the same; therefore, we have included a survey slip for you to tick yes or no and if you are willing to help us with the fundraiser.

Tickets are to be sold both locally and off island, so anyone can purchase a ticket. Here is how it works 1,000 tickets are to be sold at \$20 per ticket, for a total of \$20,000. The ticket is good for one year and then new tickets are sold at the end of the first year for the next year.

The number on your ticket could be drawn as a winner for more than one draw, so you could win more than once in the year.

The physical drawing of the numbers is done once a month and there is a number drawn for everyday of that month except for Sundays. Here is how it works:

- For every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of that month the numbers drawn will win \$20.
- For every Saturday of that month the numbers drawn will win \$100.
- In addition, a number will be drawn for the 15th on those months of February, April, July, September and December, and those numbers drawn will win \$500.

At the end of the draw, all the numbers are deposited back into the draw for the next month draw, hence your number could be drawn more than once in a year. The total payout for prizes is \$12,640, leaving \$7,360 for the Cancer Support Group each year.

Please take the time to complete the enclosed survey to indicate if you would support the

proposed lottery and submit the survey by Feb 15, 2023. These can be dropped off at the store in Van Anda or Gillies Bay. If there is enough interest, we could start the process of creating and selling tickets, and possibly have the first draw at the beginning of 2024.

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


TEXADA GUIDING & THRIFT SHOP

Texada Guiding was already going strong when I came to Texada, 48 years ago. I proposed starting a thrift shop to make money for supplies, equipment, snacks and trips. The Guides were already selling clean cut up rags in bags, so it fit right into the scheme of things. Guiding promotes recycling and reusing. The Pathfinders now even have a badge for this. We were trend setters. When I joined Guiding here there were no Pathfinders or Sparks in Canada, Only Brownies and Guides. When they introduced Pathfinders in 1979 I went to the very first training in BC, at Camp Tsoona in the Lower Mainland. I started it here on Texada and it has been going strong ever since. Sparks was introduced for ages 5 and 6 in 1989. Over the last few years the pandemic shut everything down but Girl Guides of Canada still wanted the volunteers to hold meetings and sell cookies. In 2020 the girls were expected to enroll at \$104 each, even though they weren't doing actual in-person meetings. That's when I decided to leave Girl Guides of Canada and start our own version - Texada Guiding. I wanted to see more of our thrift store money going to help the Girls on Texada and not provincial and national (where they have paid employees) We're so lucky to have Rebecca Hathaway, Sandy Harvey and Ana Botts come on board to help restart our groups. We currently have 9 Brownies age 6 to 9 and 3 Pathfinders. They have been allowed to choose their own colour shirts for Texada Guides uniforms. The Brownies chose blue and Pathfinders chose turquoise. Excited for when we have some Guides to see what colour they decide on! We meet at school as soon as school finishes and the Pathfinders meet around 4:45pm. If your daughter wishes to join or you wish to volunteer some time, please call Linn at 604-486-7468 or Becca at 604-765-5218 to register. If you are new to the island and haven't stopped in the thrift shop yet, come on in. We are like the island department store! Still only \$1 per grocery bag or \$2 per garbage bag full (or by donation) Open Sunday, Monday and Thursday 11 am to 1 pm. We also still sell those bags of rags at only \$1. Thanks to our fabulous thrift shop volunteers Diane, Shirley, Jeirdre, Margaret and Tom, Sheryl, Sue and Wade. Also thanks in memory to Dave Hull who did so many jobs for us, all for free.

The thrift shop turns 49 on February 14.



MORE ORG NEWS

TEXADA POLICING & PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

Moving forward on Texada's policing priorities.

The Texada Policing and Public Safety Committee held a well-attended meeting on January 19 for an enthusiastic discussion on policing priorities for our island. Follow-up action will be taken by community volunteers and our two RCMP Constables, Micha Yakonowsky and Josh Fralick. Here's a brief summary of meeting highlights:

- -- Marine safety: Because "kids don't float" the Texada Boating Club is looking at providing loaner life jackets for children at the harbour. Several other locations are being considered, including Shelter Point Park, Erickson's Beach, Shingle Beach, Bob's Lake and Emily Lake. This program is sponsored by Royal Canadian Marine Search and Rescue, with support from our local RCMP and Texada School.
- -- Road safety: Texada's big industrial trucks and narrow roads, often without proper pavement width and shoulders, require that everyone – including pedestrians and bicyclists - make an extra effort to travel safely on our island. The meeting consensus was that widening the roads and shoulders is a multi-million dollar fantasy, so to stay safe we need to be aware of tight spots, wear bright colours and reflective gear if you're out walking or biking the roads; if you're driving, go slow and give the big trucks the right-of-way. RCMP has spoken with residents and truck drivers alike to give friendly reminders about sharing the roads responsibly.
- -- Youth: Thanks to community volunteers led by Becca Hathaway, Constable Josh Fralick and our new Texada School Principal Alex Bella, Texada's youth will once again be invited to participate in ongoing youth activities at the RCMP station and other locations. Details are being planned now, so this would be a great time to volunteer if you're interested in helping. Contact Becca at: 604 765-5218.
- -- Crime prevention: Texada crime statistics for 2021 and 2022 were shared at the meeting by Constable Yakonowsky (see RCMP's notice elsewhere in the Express Lines). Texada is considered a low-crime community, but even one assault or break-in is too many for those affected, so we discussed the usual ways to prevent property crime: lock doors, have good lighting, keep neighbours advised if you go on holiday, and maybe put up a security camera. Assaults are often linked to domestic violence, and on Texada at present the best prevention is to get help and a safe refuge, both of which are available in Powell River through

Grace House. Committee follow-up will be to post more signage about Grace House in various locations around Texada.

-- Police-Community Relations: Just by having quarterly public meetings open to all community members and RCMP officers we're already setting a stronger foundation for working together. But the committee heard from Constable Yakonowsky that incidents are going unreported to police, even while sometimes they're posted on the Texada Message Board (Facebook). Committee consensus: only call 911 in an actual emergency, but definitely phone 604 486-7717, the Texada RCMP office, to report anything that police should know about, even if it's after-the-fact. The quicker you report, the more likely our constables can intervene effectively. It takes all of us to make a difference in public safety.

Next meeting will be at 10:00 am on Thursday, April 13 at the Texada Seniors Centre in Gillies Bay; all are welcome to bring concerns for discussion. The April Express Lines will have details on the agenda. For more info phone Roger Kimmerly at 604 486-0009.

GILLIES BAY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Report from the Chair

Some say that Gillies Bay water sucks! They are not far off the mark. Gillies Bay is not blessed with the huge glacier fed watersheds that feed many communities on the Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island. We have a 100 acre reservoir sitting in a watershed of less than 500 acres, and fed largely with seasonal rainfall and a couple of tiny seasonal creeks and ditches. The reservoir is called Cranby Lake and was created in the early 1960s by Texada Mines building a 200 meter long earth filled dam. The reservoir is somewhat spring fed, but fills primarily with winter rainfall, and shrinks during the summer mainly through evaporation. Prior to the water system being installed, many of the properties in Gillies Bay relied on shallow dug wells on individual lots. Some of these wells can still be found today. Cranby Lake and its watershed is a very healthy ecosystem, and as such is home to swans, geese, ducks, deer, raccoons, eagles, turkey vultures, frogs, toads, newts and a few species of rodents. Of course all the insects, fungi, moulds, bacteria, and viruses that go along with them are there too. There is also prolific vegetation, algae and decaying organic matter both in and around the water source. Out of all of this we draw the community's water. The primary goal is that the water is safe to drink, so health authorities require that the District treat the water with chlorine to kill the bacteria. If regular testing shows that chlorine treatment is not doing a good enough job, then the District is required to issue a "Boil Water Advisory" and keep it in place until the water quality improves. GBID usually has to go on Boil Water Advisory at least once a year, usually in the summer when the little creatures and algae are most active in the warmer water. As part of the chlorination, the health authorities require that the water contains at least 0.2 parts per million of residual chlorine at the ends of the water piping system. This means that everywhere before the end of the line may see a higher level that can sometimes result in bleach like odor. In this issue we have introduced you to the challenges Gillies Bay water faces. In upcoming issues we will try to get to the solutions. Chuck Childress



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
