
EXPRESS LINES SUBSCRIPTIONS



Garden Club Notes

Happy Gardening 2023!

In this article Carolyn Wood tempts us with ornamental grasses. Carolyn gives us lots to think about as our weather patterns and temperatures are changing!

For more tips and ideas join us for our once a month Garden Club meetings, you don't have to be a member to come. Our next meeting will be held in the Gillies Bay Community Hall on Wednesday, January 4th, from 2pm until 4pm.

You spot a drop dead gorgeous plant in a Nursery. Do you buy it or not? Beyond price, how do you go about choosing a plant for your garden?

For me, beyond the initial "spark of joy", and consideration of the plant's texture and colour, I want to know how easy it is to care for. And in these times of climate change, I especially focus on water needs; the more drought resistant the better!

With these criteria in mind, I'd like to share two ornamental grasses that, in my opinion, are stand outs. Both have finely textured leaf blades, fluffy seed heads, and contrast beautifully with broader leafed plants such as Japanese maples and ferns. And, in my garden, both are completely drought resistant. (note: they are planted in the ground; unlikely to be drought tolerant in pots)

Stipa gigantica (giant feather grass), is a striking evergreen grass, forming a clump of arching deep green foliage from which a huge sheaf of long-stemmed, oat-like flowerheads erupt in mid-summer. When mature, these splay apart to make a wide fountain shape that almost hides the plant. This graceful grass makes an excellent focal point. When backlit in the afternoon sun, the fluffy seed heads seem to glow from within. I have placed three of mine on low mounds to highlight this effect.

Equally beautiful, Miscanthus sinensis 'Gracillimus' (Maiden grass), is a dense, showy specimen grass with 4 to 6 foot long, green leaves that turn tan in winter. My three huge ones make a dramatic show of feathery blades that sway gracefully in the breezes. After their first year of getting established, I have never watered mine. They like part to full sun, average soils, and are clumping, so no need to fear spreading. Leave the seed heads over the winter, and give the Miscanthus a quick "off with their heads" trim in the spring.

Overnight Rolled Oats with Fruit (2 people)

- 2/3 c Rolled oats (raw)
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1 T chia seeds
- 1 ripe mashed banana

Almond or Oat milk to cover the oat mixture Soak overnight.

Add seasonal fresh fruit from your garden. Heat or enjoy cold. Top with nuts.

DIRECTORS REPORT

Happy New Year, everyone.

Please mark your calendars and plan to attend the **community meeting re bike paths on Texada, Tuesday, Jan. 24, 7 pm at the Hall.** Please fill out and return the survey re bike paths, found elsewhere in this *Express Lines* edition. Your opinions are important.

Grant-in-aid funding is available each year to assist Texada community groups with capital projects or staging events. Applications for these funds are due March 31 (first intake) and August 31 (second intake). If your group intends to apply for a grant, please get your application in asap. Forms are available on the qRD website or I can forward one to you. Grants typically fund one-quarter of the cost of an event or project and are allocated on a first-come basis.

Last year the qRD amended its grants-in-aid policy to include arts and

culture initiatives which were formerly funded through economic development. The tax dollars remain the same. For area D, in 2022, this added \$8,585 to our \$8,000 grant-in-aid budget, for a total of \$16,585. Funded were: **Texada Dragon Boat Club**, \$3,000; **Texada Sandcastle Weekend**, \$2,000; **Texada Rescue (VAID**), \$3,800; **TACT**, we contributed \$1,578 of the \$12,000 they

received in total; PR Academy of Music, \$1,973; PRISMA, \$2,631; PR Festival of Performing Arts, \$99; PR Orphaned Wildlife Society, \$1,315; PR

Community Foundation (Vital Signs), \$132; and qathet Old Growth, \$26.

Also on the subject of money, the **2023 budget** is being worked on. Please check out the draft financial plan on the qRD website and get back to me with your comments. A region-wide tax increase is coming because of the cost of borrowing funds to finance the **Resource Recovery Centre/Waste Transfer Station** on the former Marine Avenue landfill site. Although I didn't support funding this project initially, I recognize that it's cheaper than costs for

simply closing the landfill and provides an added benefit in the end. Grant funding to bring these costs down has been applied for.

HARRY TRIM (1842 - 1922)

Harry Trim is known in Texada's history as the discoverer of the huge iron ore deposit in 1871. A recent letter to our Historical Society from his charges of political corruption. Harry (Henry) Trim was born to a farm family in England. At age 6 Harry's family immigrated to Perth, Ontario to take advantage of the promise of free land

In 1862, lured by adventure and gold, 20-year old Harry hopped a steamer to Panama, crossed the isthmus and sailed to Victoria. From there Harry rowed himself over 200 miles to Boston Bar and the Fraser River goldfields!

After 6 years of successful prospecting his \$15,000 allowed him to finance future ventures which included whal-

at Gold Harbour (Haida Gwaii). He also worked as a pilot and captain for the "Indian Commission" for 4 years, commanding various steamers on the coast.

It was possibly during this time (1871) that Harry ventured near Texada and noted the rusty stain on the rocks at Welcome Bay which inspired him to take samples and stake a claim.

Two years later, while working at Sewell Moody's sawmill in Burrard Inlet, the Texada samples were finally assayed at Moody's office. Moody was amazed at the richness of the ore and the potential for profit. Moody, who was wellconnected with politicians in Victoria, devised a

TEXADA GOLF COURSE

January Update

As owners of the Texada Golf Course, we were unable to attend the December 11 public meeting regarding its future. However, we are grateful to more than 50 people who came to voice their support and offer suggestions for keeping the course open. To our surprise, there was near unanimous agreement to double the green fees and nine people filled out applications for volunteer work to help maintain the

course. We appreciate the many ideas proposed for offsetting costs - hole sponsorships, tournaments, grants etc. – and we may revisit these suggestions in the future.

When we purchased the property almost six years ago, we had no intention of running a public golf course because the place was in such disrepair. However, conversations with fellow islanders persuaded us that the course was and still could be a valued asset to Texadans after having been maintained by volunteers for so many years. In that spirit, and aided by our close friends, we hauled away truckloads of waste, bought more mowers, and still honoured the same historically low rates.

But the past couple of seasons has been a source of great frustration for us. We felt we were doing the island a favour by keeping the course alive, largely at our own expense. Yet there were many to whom even \$5 per round seemed too much to pay, who ignored the honour box, golfed at all hours (often loudly), and left beer cans and cigarette butts in their wake even in the driest conditions. After a long summer of sleepless nights, we were on the verge of shutting the course down completely.

After seeing the support demonstrated at the recent meeting we are encouraged to give it one more chance albeit with a few changes.

The golf course will reopen on a membership basis, for a 6-month trial from April 1 to September



30, 2023. Malle Behan has agreed to handle the memberships available for sale beginning in February. The annual membership will cost \$450 for a term of 6 months and ID cards will be issued. Drop -ins will still be welcomed at \$10 per nine holes and \$10 for each additional ninehole round. The green fees are to be deposited in the provided envelopes on which the golfer will write their name, vehicle licence number and the date of play.

Although the golf course may not be profitable even with the rate increase, we want to make it absolutely clear that our main concern is privacy and respect. This is our home. We just want to be accorded the same consideration as anyone else, while allowing you, our neighbors, to enjoy this wonderful sport.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to Rodger, Brian and Malle for making this possible. In addition, we are always looking for more volunteers, particularly someone willing to act as coordinator. If all goes well, we hope to continue to operate the golf course for many years to come.

We hope you enjoyed the holiday season and may you have many birdies in 2023. Thank you.

THROWBACK RECIPE

...at the Winter Market this year someone handed in a copy of the Texada Island Community Society's Cook Book, published in 2009. Every now and then, when space allows, a recipe will be inserted.

GOURMET MACARONI N' CHEESE

2 1/2 c macaroni	cubed
4 tbsp butter	2/3 c sour cream
4 tbsp flour	1 1/3 c cottage cheese
2 c milk	2 c old cheddar cheese, grated
1 tsp salt	$1 \ 1/2 \ c \ soft \ bread \ criumbs$
1 tsp sugar	2 tbsp butter
1/2 lb processed cheese (velveeta)	Paprika

Cook and drain macaroni. Place in greased $2\frac{1}{2}$ quart casserole dish. Melt butter over medium heat , add flour. Mix well.

Add milk and cook over medium heat until thickened, stirring constantly. Add salt, sugar and cheese. Mix well. Mix sour cream and cottage cheese into sauce.

Pour sauce over macaroni and mix well. Sprinkle cheddar cheese and bread crumbs over top. Dot with 2 tbsp butter and sprinkle with paprika. May be frozen at this point.

Bake at 350 degrees F for 45-50 minutes.

Did vou know dryer lint is a great fire fuel starter? Texada Naturekids learned that and so much more Saturday. December 3rd during the Survival Fire Building session. Thank you to Tyler Danczak for leading this super fun session and implementing a thoroughly engaging lesson plan. A warm community event enjoyed by all! Tyler reviewed safety tips learned at our previous session with the Gillies Bay Fire Department; components of a campfire and materials we can use for fuel, heat and oxygen. Tyler showed examples and taught us the benefits of five different types of campfires: 1) teepee, 2) log cabin (holds heat), 3) log pole (conserves fuel), 4) inverted pyramid (useful for cooking) and 5) lean-to campfire (easy to build)). Thank you to John Whitehead for help coordinating this event, hosting it at his beautiful home, and sharing his scouting experience and awesome survival tips (e.g. a pitchy pine cone is a great, lasting fire starter). With all the interactive demonstrations, children were then able to experience building their own fires and practice with sparkers, matches and lighters, within fire pits in small groups with the help of volunteers. Thank you to volunteers Carolanne White and Sofia Khan and parents who pitched in to help children build fires and stay safe around the fires.

TEXADA POLICING & PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITEE

PRIORITY'S

At our last public meeting on October 20 Cst Micha Yakonowsky identified seven areas identified as RCMP priorities for policing on Texada and the Powell River area. They are: Traffic Safety, Youth, Crime Reduction, Police/Community relations, Domestic Violence, Indigenous Safety/Healthy Indigenous Community, and Employee Wellness. These priorities, and others, including hunting safety on Texada, are reviewed every year.

Our next public meeting will focus on discussion about policing priorities; join us on January 19 (Thursday) at 4:00 PM at the Legion. Everyone is welcome – please bring your curiosity, questions and concerns!

Around traffic safety we can discuss reducing impaired driving, encouraging use of seat belts, speed enforcement and any particularly dangerous spots on the road. The Texada policing committee is planning our contribution to youth/ police relations right now - what is your input? About crime reduction there are many approaches that might be considered, for example better security or appropriate locks, neighbourly watching the community, and dealing with prolific offenders.

Concerning domestic violence there is probably a concern about public discussion: there might be a more secure and private process to identify what may help. Victim services is an area not presently identified in the list which we could discuss.

Under the heading "Employee Wellness" there are several important issues; one is training. There has been public discussion around the province and in the country around police training, topics that have been identified include dealing with persons with dementia, persons suffering from trauma or long term effects from trauma, conditions like autism, and many other concerns. There is an evolving understanding of community responsibility for things like health checks, dealing with drug overdose which involve a police presence and also paramedic attention. Our voluntary firefighters are increasingly being called upon to help.

Our opportunity to discuss these concerns with the police serving our community, and what may be of interest to you, is scheduled for January 19th at 4:00 PM at the legion. Report from the Chair

The New Year brings more of the same as we move slowly and carefully along with plans for our system upgrades. Early in the New Year we should hear back on our grant application to provide major capital funding to enable us to move forward. In the meantime we are making progress on some of the things that need to be done regardless of status of the grant. We have completed the legal survey of the new site(s) for the new treatment plant and water tower. We also have a spillway issue to deal with at the dam. The wooden spillway liner is about sixty years old and is in need of major repair or replacement. We have struck a committee to get moving on the spillway project with a plan to have the work competed in 2023.

Speaking of committees, all of our committee meetings are open to the public, as are all of our meetings. The staff will be posting meeting time and dates on our website and on Texada Message Board. We do not hold secret meetings. The Board would like to encourage more public involvement. The water system belongs to the ratepayers, sort of like a co -op, and the trustees are just volunteers elected by the ratepayers and "entrusted" with managing the water system and Fire Department. The Trustees pay the same taxes and tolls as everyone else. We are all in this together so if you want to know more and/or be involved in what is happening, just come see us. **Chuck Childress, Chair GBID**
